RESOLUTION

For the appointment of a Commissioner to take charge of the Peninsula
 at the Bay of Presque Isle.

WHEREAS, The period for which Rufus S. Reed was
 appointed commissioner to take charge of the Peninsula at Preamble
 the Bay of Presque Isle, on Lake Erie, by the resolution of
 the eighth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-
 three, has expired.

And whereas, The necessity of preventing trespass on
 said Peninsula still exists:

Therefore,

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives*
of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assem-
bly met, That Rufus S. Reed, of the borough of Erie, in the Rufus S. Reed
 county of Erie, be, and he is hereby appointed a commissioner re-appointed;
 er, for five years, to take charge of the Peninsula at the Bay commissioner,
 of Presque Isle, under the resolution of the eighth of April,
 one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three. *Provided,* Provide
 That if the said Rufus S. Reed should refuse to accept, or
 should die, or resign, or the said commission should, by any

Vacancy how filled other means, become vacant before the expiration of the time specified for its continuance, the governor shall in that case fill said vacancy.

Preamble WHEREAS, James Barton, of Milford township, in Pike county, by authority of an act of general assembly, did introduce water into the town of Milford aforesaid, at his own expense, and that some years after the introduction of the water aforesaid, the said James Barton, being in bad health, made a deed of trust of said property for the benefit of his wife and grand children, in the case of his death, and the said James Barton, having recovered his health, is desirous of being reinstated in his rights as they existed before the said deed of trust, and the said trustees also declining to act, and the aforesaid water works are getting out of repair and will soon become useless:

Therefore,

James Barton reinstated in certain rights RESOLVED, That from and after the passing of this resolution the aforesaid deed of trust shall be considered as of no effect or validity, and the said James Barton shall be considered the owner and proprietor of the said water works, and have the same management, ownership, and control over the same, as if the said deed of trust had never been executed by him.

Directors of common schools of city of Lancaster authorized to pay secretary To allow their treasurer per centage RESOLVED, That the directors of the common schools of the city of Lancaster, are hereby authorized to make their secretary such moderate compensation for the performance of all acts and duties pertaining to his office, as the board may determine to be reasonable, and the said directors are also authorized to allow their treasurer, for the performance of all acts and duties lawfully pertaining to his office as district treasurer, to retain such per centage on all moneys actually received and paid out by him in the course of the year, as they may deem a proper and moderate compensation for his services.
