RESOLUTION

Authorizing a temporary Loan.

RESOLVED, By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the governor be, and he is hereby authorized to negotiate a temporary loan of six hundred and two thousand two hundred and fifty dollars, at an interest not exceeding five per cent per annum, with any bank corporation, individual or individuals, as in his opinion may be most advantageous; the money so borrowed to be applied to the payment of the interest due upon the public debt on the first day of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, and to be repaid to the

lender or the lenders out of the permanent loan authorized by the act passed on the twenty-sixth day of January, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, entitled an act authorizing a loan within six months after the passage of this resolution.

RESOLUTION

Relative to the appointment of Commissioners on the Cumberland Road.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That each of the commissioners, within the limits of Pennsylvania on the Cumberland road, who now are, or shall hereafter be appointed, before entering upon the performance of his duties, shall give a bond to the commonwealth in the penal sum of six thousand dollars, with security to be approved of by one of the judges of the court of common pleas of Somerset, Fayette, or Washington counties, conditioned for the faithful performance of their respective duties, and also, that so much of the law as is altered or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.
