## RESOLUTION

Relative to the preservation and repair of the Public Buildings, and the improvement of the Public Ground.

*RESOLVED, By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That the secretary of the land office, the clerk of the senate and the clerk of the house of representatives, be, and they are hereby appointed commissioners whose duty it shall be to cause the out-side of the state capitol to be painted, as far as may be necessary : and also, to cause all needful and proper repairs to be done to said capitol and the adjoining public offices, including the painting of the latter if deemed necessary ; and that the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars, be, and the same is hereby appropriated for the purposes aforesaid, to be drawn from the state treasury, on warrants of the governor in favor of said commissioners. *And be it further resolved,* That the said commissioners shall employ a suitable person to improve so much of the public ground as is inclosed on capitol hill, by effectually fertilizing the same, in such a manner as to render it capable of the growth and production of ornamental trees and shrubbery, including a variety of evergreens, and cause such to be planted therein the ensuing autumn or subsequent spring, preparatory to which said ground shall be laid out in gravelled walks, in a neat and appropriate manner, the major part of such trees to be indigenous and of such species as from their adaption to the soil and climate, will secure their speedy growth ; and that the sum of two thousand dollars, be, and hereby is appropriated, to be applied by said commissioners for the purpose of defraying the expenses incident to the improvement of the public ground, as aforesaid, and the taking care of the same, which sum shall be drawn from the treasury, upon the governor's warrant in favor of said com-
