RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That the balance of the appropriations made under the act, entitled an act to establish a general system of education by common schools, passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, and the several supplements thereto, and the balance of the first appropriation of
