RESOLUTION

Authorizing the erection of a building for an office for the Auditor General, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, Much confusion exists among the papers and documents in the auditor general's office; much unnecessary and vexatious labor is imposed upon those entrusted with the performance of its duties, and much public loss will eventually be sustained from the present existing condition of affairs therein, when, for want of room, they have been obliged to pile one mass of papers on another, not being able to arrange and file the same, and have even been obliged to make the basement story the depository of several boxes containing papers that may be called for, and hence, are useful: *And whereas,* These evils must be aggravated in a ratio, corresponding with the extension of our public improvements, and the increase of business upon our public works:

Therefore, be it

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met,* That the governor, auditor general and state treasurer, be constituted commissioners, whose duty it shall be to cause a suitable building to be designed by a competent architect, appointed by the governor, to be constructed as

soon as practicable, to serve as an office for the auditor general, towards the cost of which the sum of ten thousand dollars is hereby granted and allowed to be paid from any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, to be drawn upon the warrant of said commissioners, as occasion may require.

SECTION 2. RESOLVED, That the lien, right, title and claim of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania of, in, and to certain lots of ground in the borough of Huntingdon, in the county of Huntingdon, by, and in pursuance of a certain mortgage given by John Cadwalader to the commissioners of said county for the use of this commonwealth, dated the sixth of August, seventeen hundred and ninety-three, and recorded in book C, page two hundred and fifty-three, (253) in the recorder's office of Huntingdon county; and of a certain mortgage given by Stephen Durry to same, for same use, dated the thirty-first August, seventeen hundred and ninety-three, recorded in book C, page two hundred and fifty-eight, (258) in said office, is hereby transferred to, and vested and confirmed in the said county of Huntingdon, for the use and purpose of building by said county of a court house, and other necessary buildings for said county therewith and thereon, and for such other uses as the commissioners of said county shall hereafter determine.
