

Name. incorporated into a body politic and corporate, in deed and in law, by the name of the "Philadelphia and Havre-de-Grace steam tow boat company," and as such to conduct a line or lines of barges and canal boats and steam boats, between the port of Philadelphia and any point or points on the Chesapeake bay, at or near Havre-de-Grace, in the State of Maryland, and to purchase, hold, and enjoy such estate, real and personal, as may be necessary for carrying into effect the objects of this association, the capital stock of said company to be forty thousand dollars, in shares of fifty dollars each, and the said corporation to have the same privileges and be subject to the same liabilities, except as hereinafter excepted, as are conferred and imposed on the "Philadelphia steam tow boat company," by an act passed the seventh day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two, and the supplement thereto passed the eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

Letters patent SECTION 2. That the letters patent declaring said corporators to be a body politic in law, shall issue whenever two hundred shares of said stock shall be subscribed, and ten dollars on each share paid in, and that the affairs of the said company shall be conducted by a board of five directors, and ten days notice shall be given for the calling in of any instalments on said capital stock.

AN ACT

Relative to the election of Supervisors in Fannet township, in Franklin county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the eighty-first section of the act of the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, "relating to counties and townships and coun-

AN ACT

Authorizing the Commissioners of Huntingdon county to borrow a sum of money.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same:* That the commissioners of the county of Huntingdon are hereby authorized and empowered to borrow any sum or sums of money not exceeding five thousand dollars, at any rate of interest not exceeding six per centum per annum, in the name and upon the faith, credit and responsibility of the said county, to be repaid at the expiration of one year or upwards out of the funds of the said county, the interest thereon to be paid at such times as may be agreed upon.

Comm'rs may borrow money not exceeding \$5,000 int'st not to exceed five per cent.
