AN ACT

For the relief of John Stewart and others, soldiers, and Sarah Sebring and others, widows of soldiers, of the revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same:* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Stewart of Erie county, or to his order, forty dollars as a gratuity in full for his services rendered during the Indian war. Relief of soldiers & widows of soldiers in Erie co.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to Sarah Sebring, of Luzerne Luzerne co. county, Sarah Earle of Allegheny county, and Marianna Allegheny co. Smith of Northampton county, widows of soldiers of the revo- North'ton co. lutionary war, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half-yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

SECTION 3. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay unto Alexander Long of Beaver county, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity and in full for military services rendered during the Indian war.

SECTION 4. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to Martha Hinton and Mary Koken of Centre county, Susannah Miller of Montgomery county, Julianna Ream of Lancaster county, and to Rachel Felton of Luzerne county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars each during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

SECTION 5. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay unto David Rankin of Jefferson county, or to his order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half-yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

SECTION 6. That the state treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay unto Susannah Wand of Harford county, in the State of Maryland, or to her order, forty dollars immediately, and an annuity of forty dollars during her life, payable half-yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one; the foregoing gratuities and annuities to be paid in conformity to the existing laws.
