A SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act relating to the support and employment of the poor."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the eighth section of the act entitled "An act relating to the employment and support of the poor," as requires the approbation and consent of two or more magistrates of the county to put out as apprentices all poor children whose parents are dead, or by said magistrates found unable to maintain them, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as the same relates to the county of Perry; and that the directors of the poor and house of employment for said county be, and they are hereby authorized, to bind out as apprentices such poor children without the consent of two justices, as is provided for in said section, being bound in all other respects by the provisions of said section and of said act.

Directors of poor of Perry co. may bind out poor children without consent of magistrates.

SECTION 2. The said directors are hereby authorized to administer all oaths and affirmations necessary for the examinations of paupers, and for other purposes, in relation to their official duty.

AN ACT

To revive and keep in force an act relative to the location of a state road, from Shippensburg in Cumberland county, to Drake's Ferry in Huntingdon county.

WHEREAS, By the sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth, and tenth Preamble sections of an act passed the twenty-fifth day of March, Anno

Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, entitled "An act to authorize the Governor to incorporate the president, managers, and company, of the Centreville and Donegal clay turnpike road company, and for other purposes," commissioners were appointed to lay out and mark a state road from Shippenburg in Cumberland county, to Drake's Ferry in Huntingdon county. And by the first section of an act passed the twenty-first day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty, entitled "An act to revive and keep in force the sixth, seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth sections of the above recited act, and for other purposes," the time for completing the location of said road, was extended until the first day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, but owing to unavoidable causes the commissioners have hitherto been prevented from attending to the duties required,

Therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the time for completing the location and survey of said road be, and the same is hereby continued, for the term of two years from and after the first day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, changing only two of the commissioners therein named, and appointing William Harris and Thomas M. McKim, of Franklin county, in the room of Joseph Pumroy and William S. Lyons, therein named. And every thing done and performed by the above named commissioners, pursuant to the provisions of the sections above designated, is hereby declared as virtual and effective as if done within the time in said act mentioned.
