AN ACT

To authorize the Auditor General to issue Certificates of State Stock to Samuel and James Corrie.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for the Auditor General, to cause to be issued new certificates of debt of this Commonwealth, to Samuel Corrie and James Corrie, for their proportional share of a certificate formerly issued, and numbered two thousand and eighty-six of the State five per cent stock, redeemable in one thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, in lieu of said certificate number two thousand and eighty-six, on satisfactory proof being made that such certificate is of record in the court of first instance of civil jurisdiction of the Island of Trinidad, and as such record cannot be taken therefrom, and

that said Samuel and James Corrie have an interest in the same, and are entitled to a share thereof, and on such indemnity being given as entirely to protect the interests of the Commonwealth in the premises.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act for the regulation of the Militia of this Commonwealth."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the enrolled militia attached to the thirty-ninth and one hundred and thirteenth regiments, first brigade, eleventh division, Pennsylvania militia, residing within the following bounds, shall hereafter compose a separate battalion, to be called the third battalion of the one hundred and thirteenth regiment, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding: that is to say, commencing at Gibson's mill; thence along the Sherman's creek to Billows bridge; thence to the Methodist church near Albright's; thence across Dick's hill, to the state road near William Campbell's; thence across Mochanoy to Caroline furnace; thence up the Juniata river to the mouth of Big Buffalo creek; thence up the said creek to the house of John Smith, jr., near Milford; thence to the road leading from Milford to Racoon; thence along said road to Donnelly's saw mill; thence up Racoon hill to the Saville township line; thence along said township line to Jacob Burd's land, on Middle ridge; thence to the Centre township line, near John Smith's; thence along the Centre township line to Abraham Kistler's; thence along said line to M'Cord's saw mill; thence down the run to the place of beginning; and that the said battalion shall meet in the borough of Bloomfield, in Perry county: *Provided,* That if at any time hereafter, it shall be found necessary to attach said battalion to any other
