A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act for the regulation of the Militia of this Commonwealth."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the enrolled militia attached to the thirty-ninth and one hundred and thirteenth regiments, first brigade, eleventh division, Pennsylvania militia, residing within the following bounds, shall hereafter compose a separate battalion, to be called the third battalion of the one hundred and thirteenth regiment, any thing in any former law to the contrary notwithstanding: that is to say, commencing at Gibson's mill; thence along the Sherman's creek to Billows bridge; thence to the Methodist church near Albright's; thence across Dick's hill, to the state road near William Campbell's; thence across Mochanoy to Caroline furnace; thence up the Juniata river to the mouth of Big Buffalo creek; thence up the said creek to the house of John Smith, jr., near Milford; thence to the road leading from Milford to Racoon; thence along said road to Donnelly's saw mill; thence up Racoon hill to the Saville township line; thence along said township line to Jacob Burd's land, on Middle ridge; thence to the Centre township line, near John Smith's; thence along the Centre township line to Abraham Kistler's; thence along said line to M'Cord's saw mill; thence down the run to the place of beginning; and that the said battalion shall meet in the borough of Bloomfield, in Perry county: *Provided,* That if at any time hereafter, it shall be found necessary to attach said battalion to any other

battalion, so as to form a new regiment, it shall be done in the manner prescribed by the sixth section of the act to which this is a supplement, passed the second April, eighteen hundred and twenty-two: *And provided further*, That the enrolled militia of the third battalion aforesaid, shall be entitled to elect one major for said battalion, the first election to be held at such time as may be fixed upon by the proper brigade inspector.

2d Proviso. SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the militia of this Commonwealth belonging to or included within the bounds of the second brigade, in the ninth division, shall be paraded and trained in companies, on the third Monday's of June, of each year; and the battalion trainings shall commence on the fourth Monday's of June, in each year, and shall continue in such order as the brigade inspector shall direct, until the whole of the brigade shall have been trained, in accordance with the provisions of existing laws.

2d brigade 9th division P. M. how & when paraded and trained. COURTS OF APPEAL WHEN HELD. SECTION 3. That the courts of appeal required to be held on the second Mondays of June, by the twenty-fifth section of the act of second April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and twenty-two, shall meet in the said brigade on the first Monday of August, in each year.

SECTION 4. That so much of any acts as are hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.

AN ACT.
