SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the militia of this Commonwealth belonging to or included within the bounds of the second brigade, in the ninth division, shall be paraded and trained in companies, on the third Monday's of June, of each year; and the battalion trainings shall commence on the fourth Monday's of June, in each year, and shall continue in such order as the brigade inspector shall direct, until the whole of the brigade shall have been trained, in accordance with the provisions of existing laws.

SECTION 3. That the courts of appeal required to be held on the second Mondays of June, by the twenty-fifth section of the act of second April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and twenty-two, shall meet in the said brigade on the first Monday of August, in each year.

SECTION 4. That so much of any acts as are hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.

## AN ACT.

To prevent the destruction of small insectivorous birds during their breeding time, and for the protection of game when out of season, in the county of Chester, and the township of Hellam in the county of York, and the township of Northampton, in the county of Lehigh and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same:* That from and after the passage of this act it shall

SECTION 9. That the stockholders of the Southern Insurance and trust company of Philadelphia are hereby authorized to reduce the capital stock of said company to two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, divided into shares of twenty five dollars each, and at all elections for directors of said company the stockholders thereof, shall be entitled to one vote for each share, held by him, her or them for thirty days previous to such election: *Provided however*, that no vote shall be given by proxy, and the Governør is hereby authorized to issue letters patent confirming the rights, powers, privileges and existence granted to said company by the act of incorporation, passed on the seventh day of April, eighteen hundred and forty.

## AN ACT.

To divide certain Wards, in the City of Philadelphia, into Election precincts, and to increase the number of Councilmen in the Borough of Manayunk.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same:* That for all general and special elections, after the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty one, Cedar ward, Locust ward, North ward, South Mulberry ward and North Mulberry ward, in the city of Philadelphia, shall each be divided into two election precincts to be bounded and described as follows: South Cedar bounded by the west side of Delaware Seventh street, the south side of Pine street, the north side of Cedar street and the river Schuylkill; North Cedar bounded by the west side of Delaware Seventh street, the north side of Pine street, the south side of Spruce street and the river Schuylkill; East Locust bounded by the west side of Delaware Seventh street, the north side of Spruce street, the east side of
