That from and after the passage of this act, the volunteer company, called the Washington Cavalry, of the county of Northampton, and the volunteer company called the Pennsylvania Rifle Rangers, in said county, shall be exempted from parading or drilling with any regiment or battalion of militia, except at the discretion of said companies: *Provided*, That the said companies shall meet and drill the proper number of days required by law, in their company capacity: *And provided further*, That in all elections and calls into actual service, the said companies shall nevertheless be considered as attached to the regiments to which they now respectively belong.

## A N A C T

To incorporate the Diamond Coal Company, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That William A. Budd, Thomas A. Budd, Thomas Bell, Adam Shoemaker, Edward L. Taylor, George Warder, associates, successors and assigns, he and they are hereby constituted a body politic and corporate, by the name, style, and title of the Diamond Coal company, and the said company shall possess and enjoy all the powers, privileges and immunities, and be subject to the terms, restrictions, and conditioned in an act entitled an act to incorporate the Sugar Loaf Coal company, passed the second day of April, A. D. one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight. *Provided*, That the land of said company shall not exceed two thousand acres, and shall all lie in Sugar Loaf and Hanover townships in the county of Luzerne and Lausanne township in the county of

Northampton, and that the capital stock of said company shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars. *And provided further,* That said company shall make an annual return on the oath of the president or secretary of said company of the amount of dividends, and they shall pay into the state treasury a tax of eight per cent on all dividends when they shall declare dividends exceeding six per cent per annum. SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the volunteer company of the borough of Easton, in the county of Northampton, called "The Democratic Artillery," now attached to the ninety-seventh regiment, shall be exempt from parading or drilling with any regiment or battalion of militia, except at the discretion of said company: *Provided,* That the said company shall meet and drill the proper number of days required by law in their company capacity: *And provided further,* That in all elections and calls into actual service, the said company shall nevertheless be considered as attached to the said ninety-seventh regiment. ## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the several acts relating to the Insurance Company of the State of Pennsylvania.

WHEREAS, The insurance company of the State of Pennsylvania have made request that they may be permitted to reduce the amount of their capital. *Therefore* Preamble.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall be lawful for the said insurance company whenever a majority in number and value of the stockholders shall deem it expedient, and express their assent thereto in writing, to reduce their capital stock to the sum of two hundred thousand dollars, and the par value of the shares Capital stock and shares
