AN ACT

Requiring the Burgess of the borough of Kittanning, Armstrong county, to perform certain duties.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of May next, all the duties and powers of the overseers of the poor of the said borough, be and the same are hereby vested in the burgess of said borough, who is hereby required to perform all the duties hitherto done and performed by the said overseers, and that the office of overseer be, and the same is hereby, abolished.

SECTION 2. The said burgess shall receive such compensation, as the town council for the time being may from time to time determine. The accounts of the burgess, shall be audited and settled by the auditors of said borough.

AN ACT

To authorize Gates Wilcox, William Perry and others, to erect a Wing Dam in the West Branch of the Susquehanna river.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Gates Wilcox, William Perry, Richard Cochran, Andrew Cochran and John D. Beers, and

their associates and assigns, are hereby authorized to erect a dam across the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, in Loyalsock and Clinton townships, Lycoming county, extending from the upper end of Hepburn's Island to the southern shore of the river, and not exceeding two feet in height, for the purpose of supplying their mills with an additional quantity of water, and to be so constructed as to do no injury to the rights of individuals, or to obstruct or impede the ascending or descending navigation of said river.

AN ACT

To provide for a survey of the borough of Frankford, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the burgesses and inhabitants of the said borough of Frankford, in the county of Philadelphia, are hereby authorized and required to appoint one or more surveyors, who shall at all times be directed and governed by the said burgesses and inhabitants, and who are hereby enjoined and required, as soon as conveniently may be, to survey and mark the lines of all the streets, roads, lanes, courts and alleys, now opened or intended to be opened for public use within the said borough, and also to survey and lay out such other new streets, lanes, courts and alleys, and common sewers within the said borough as he or they shall deem necessary for a regular and convenient town plan, and for the more equal distribution and ready discharge of the waters thereof, and for that purpose the said surveyor
