A N A C T

To annul the marriage contract of Eliphalet Thompson with Phebe his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same:* That the marriage contract entered into by and between Eliphalet Thompson and Phebe Thompson his wife, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from the said contract and from all the legal duties and obligations arising therefrom as fully, effectually, and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to render illegitimate the child or children of said marriage.
