SECTION 4. If any person shall, in order to secure the reward authorized by this act to be paid for the scalp of any wolf, panther, fox, wild cat or mink, resort to the breeding and rearing of any of the aforesaid animals, such person, on conviction before a court of quarter sessions, shall be liable to a fine of not less than forty nor more than one hundred dollars, at the discretion of the court, which fine, when it shall have been recovered, shall be paid to the treasurer of the proper county, to be applied as other county funds are applied. Penalty for violat'n of the provisions of this act

SECTION 5. That so much of any former act or acts as are hereby altered and supplied, be and the same are hereby repealed, so far as relates to the aforesaid counties. Rep'lig clause

SECTION 6. That the second section of the act entitled an act to extend the charter of the Lebanon Bank, passed the twenty-fifth day of May, A. D. eighteen hundred and forty, be and the same is hereby repealed. Repeal of sec rel to Lebanon Bank

AN ACT

Authorizing the Canal Commissioners to settle with William B. Foster, for the expenses of the survey of the Lackawanna river and valley.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners are hereby authorized to settle the account of William B. A N A C T

Relative to the erection of a Lock-up House, in the borough of Elizabeth, in Allegheny county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the burgess and town council of the borough of Elizabeth, in the county of Allegheny, be and they are hereby authorized to build and erect or provide and support in or contiguous to said borough, a suitable building, to be used as a lock-up house or place of security for the temporary detention of persons committed by a justice of the peace on any criminal charge for which such person or persons could be lawfully committed to the county prison, there to remain and be kept until such offender can be conveniently conveyed to the county prison, or until discharged according to law. *Provided*, That no person committed by a justice of the peace shall be confined in said house for a longer period than thirty-six hours.
