## A N A C T

To incorporate the Equitable Insurance, Life Insurance, Annuity and Trust Company, and for other purposes.

**SECTION 1.** *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Lawrence Johnson, Samuel C. Morton, John Leadbeater, junior, James Mitchel, John C. Martin, Isaac Otis, Reese D. Fell, Joel Cook, William P. Smith, William F. Spackman, Thomas T. Smiley, J. B. Smith, and all and every other person or persons who shall hereafter become stockholders of the Equitable Insurance, Life Insurance, Annuity and Trust Company, be and they are hereby created and made a corporation or body politic and corporate, by the name and style of the "Equitable Insurance, Life Insurance, Annuity and Trust Company," with all the authority, powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the regulations, restrictions and legal provisions now enjoyed by and imposed upon the "Philadelphia Fire and Inland Navigation Insurance Company." *Provided,* That the company hereby incorporated shall issue no notes or bills of credit or promissory notes,

in the nature of bank notes, nor exercise any banking privileges whatever. *And provided also*, That the legislature shall have power, at any time when the privileges hereby granted shall appear injurious to the public, to repeal, alter or amend this act, but no such repeal, alteration or amendment shall affect any engagement to which the said corporation shall have become a party previous thereto; and in case of such repeal, the said company shall have a reasonable time to bring their affairs to a final settlement and termination. *And provided further*, That the said company shall be subject to such provisions and regulations as the legislature may at any time enact for taxing the insurance companies of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of the act entitled an act relative to suits brought by and against canal and railroad companies, passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, and its supplement thereto, be and they are hereby extended to an action now pending in the court of common pleas of Berks county, of August term, one thousand eight hundred and forty, number ———, wherein Christian Grenier is plaintiff and the county of Berks defendant.

SECTION 3. That the proper authorities of the borough of Freeport, Armstrong county, be and they are hereby authorized to extend Fourth street, in said borough, from its present termination to the public road leading from Freeport to Butler.
