## A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act entitled "An act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a General System of Education by Common Schools," passed the thirteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That any college in this Commonwealth incorporated by the legislature, and maintaining at least four professors, shall be entitled to the benefit of the fourth section of the act of twelfth April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, although they may not have instructed constantly one hundred students, but that every such college, upon furnishing the state treasurer with a certificate verified by the oath or affirmation of the president of the board of trustees, or one of the professors, shewing the number of students under instruction, shall be entitled to draw such proportion of the sum of one thousand dollars per annum given by that act, as the number of students constantly instructed during each term shall bear to the number of one hundred: *Provided,* That no college having less than seventy-five students constantly under

instruction during each term, shall be entitled to the benefit of this act or the act to which this is a supplement.

SECTION 2. Whenever a new school district shall be formed in any county in this Commonwealth, it shall be the duty of the commissioners thereof to certify to the superintendent of common schools, before the commencement of the next succeeding school year, the number of taxable inhabitants therein, and also the number in the district or districts from which it was taken, separately, according to the last preceding triennial enumeration of taxables made for school purposes, so that the whole number in such new district and in that or those out of which it was taken, being added together, shall be neither greater nor less than the number that was therein before the change was made, and according to the last triennial certificate or return of taxables thereof made by said commissioners.

SECTION 3. That the period specified in the twenty-eighth section of an act passed thirteenth March, eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, within which the Windsorhaven bridge company were to commence their work, is hereby extended five years; and so much of said act as is hereby altered is hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. WHEREAS, Messrs. Clark and Harrison became contractors for and erected a bridge over the West Branch of the Susquehanna river, at Karthaus, agreeably to the plan and specifications furnished by Charles L. Schlatter, the engineer designated for that purpose by the canal commissioners, agreeably to the resolution of the thirteenth of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty, entitled "Resolution making appropriation to erect a bridge over the West Branch of the Susquehanna, at Karthaus," by which the sum of seven thousand two hundred dollars was specifically appropriated for that purpose:

And whereas, It is represented that by the orders and directions of the state engineers having charge of the work, additional work was done not specified in the contract and specifications thereof, under which the said contractors undertook the erecting the said bridge, which said additional work consisted in the construction of two additional ice-breakers to the abutments of said bridge, amounting, according to the estimate made thereof by the said engineer, to the sum of two hundred and sixty-six dollars twenty cents, for which the said contractors have never received any compensation: Therefore,

Be it enacted, That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized and required to examine into the said claim, and if they find that the said additional work was done by authority of the state engineer, and that the same was not embraced in the contract and specifications thereof under which the said Clark and Harrison undertook and contracted for the building of said bridge, and that they have never been paid therefor; that then and in such case, they be and are hereby

SECTION 5. That the reference which is made in the tenth section of the act entitled "An act for enabling religious societies within this Commonwealth to purchase and hold lands for burying grounds and churches, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-second day of April, A. D. eighteen hundred and forty-one, to the fourth section of said act, be and the same is hereby changed, and shall be hereafter taken to be a reference to the ninth section thereof, and that which is made in the fifteenth section of the same to the preamble thereto, shall be hereafter taken to be a reference to the fifth section thereof, and that which is made in the sixteenth and seventeenth sections of the said act to the second section of the same shall be hereafter taken to be the seventh section of the said recited act, as fully and effectually as if the references had been so made originally in said act, and so much of the same as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.
