AN ACT

For the relief of Michael Weidner and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to Michael Weidner, of York county, Absalom Monks, of Butler county, John Myers, and Frederick Merriman, of Allegheny county, and Joseph Cannon of Jefferson county, Ohio, soldiers, and to Elizabeth Doll, of York county, Mary Campbell, of Butler county, Margaret Keppel, and Margaret Seitzinger, of Berks county, Margaret Cunningham, of Juniata county, and Mary Dempsey, of Chester county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars immediately, as a gratuity and annuity of forty dollars annually during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

Relief of soldiers and widows in York, Butler, Allegheny, Jefferson co Ohio York, Butler, Berks, Juniata and Chester counties

Westmoreland

SECTION 2. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay Daniel Tar, of Westmoreland county, a soldier of the revolutionary and Indian wars, forty dollars, as a gratuity and compensation in full, for services rendered by him during the said wars.

Lycoming York

SECTION 3. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Margaret Dimin, of Lycoming county, and Barbara Myers of York county, widows of soldiers of the revolutionary war, forty dollars, as a gratuity and compensation in full for services rendered by their husbands during said war.

Philadelphia

SECTION 4. The state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Mary Magdalene Rees, of Philadelphia county, the gratuity of forty dollars, which was granted to her late husband, John Rees, by act of assembly, approved on the twelfth day of June, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty, but which was not paid to the said John Rees, in consequence of his decease having occurred a few days previous to the date of the act. The foregoing gratuities and pensions to be paid in conformity with the existing laws.

SECTION 5. That the state treasurer be and he is hereby

authorized and required to pay to Polly Lanhar, and Catharine Shade, of Franklin county, or to their legal representatives, the sum of two hundred dollars, as compensation in full for donation land due to George Snyder, a soldier of the revolutionary war, and father of the said Polly Lanhar, and Catharine Shade.

AN ACT

To Incorporate the Wilkesburg Railroad Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority* Commis'rs
of the same, That James Kelly, Abraham Horbach, Harmar Denny, William Peebles, William Noble, John Roup, Francis Bailey, (Liberty street,) James Dunlop, Christian Painter, Thomas Scott, John Shoenberger, William Wilkins and Robert Graham, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners; and they, or any three of them are authorized to open books at such times and places and upon such notices as they may deem expedient, for the purpose of receiving subscriptions to the capital stock of the company hereinafter directed to be incorporated, and to keep open the said books until such an amount of the said stock is subscribed as may be necessary to its incorporation. Stock, sub-
scription
Provided, That the same are not kept open longer than two years from the time of their first being opened. And if any of said commissioners shall resign, neglect to act, be absent, or become legally incapacitated to act, during the continuance of the duties devolved upon them by this act, others may be appointed in their stead, by a majority of the persons named in this act, and that moreover the sum of two dollars shall be paid on each share when subscribed. Capital stock
SECTION 2. That the capital stock of said company shall be one hundred thousand dollars, in shares of twenty-five dollars
