A N A C T

Relating to Banks, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the first day of July next, it shall not be lawful for any bank in this Commonwealth, to issue or re-issue any certificate in the similitude of a bank note, purporting to be receivable on deposit, special or general, under a penalty of five dollars for every certificate so issued or received, to be recovered as debts of like amount are by law recoverable, for the use of the person suing therefor; and the said bank shall be liable for any such issue already made, as if the same were made payable on demand, and were in the form of a bank note: *Provided,* That nothing contained in this act shall be so construed as to prevent the banks of this Commonwealth from issuing or re-issuing the notes authorized by the act entitled "An act to provide revenue to meet the demands on the treasury, and for other purposes," passed the fourth May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one. Banks prohibited issuing certificates of deposit or post notes of the similitude of bank notes

SECTION 2. That in addition to the powers and privileges conferred upon and vested in the Allegheny coal company, by an act passed on the twenty-fifth day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, be and the said company is hereby authorized and empowered to manufacture iron, in all the various branches of said manufacture, and to erect such buildings and machinery as may be necessary and incident thereto. And the said company shall have power and authority to increase the capital stock thereof to five hundred thousand dollars, and to hold any quantity of lands not exceeding four thousand acres, to be situate in the county of Somerset. SECTION 3. That the said Allegheny coal company shall have power and authority to construct such railroad or railroads as may be deemed necessary, with one or more tracks, from any point or points on their lands to the Maryland state line, in the direction of Cumberland. And the twelfth section of the act to which this section is supplementary, be and the same is hereby repealed.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an Act entitled "An act to Incorporate a Company to make a Turnpike Road from the borough of Blairsville, in Indiana county, to Mount Pleasant, in Westmoreland county," passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act to which this is a supplement, be and the same is hereby altered and amended, so as to authorize the Governor to incorporate a separate company, under the style and title of "the Farmers' and Mechanics' Turnpike Road Company of Westmoreland County," and that the said company be authorized to make a turnpike road from some point on the Pennsylvania canal, within one mile of the Broad Fording, on the Conemaugh river, to a point on the Stoystown and Greensburg turnpike road, at the dwelling house of Alexander Johnston, so as in the opinion of the president and managers of the said company, to combine among other advantages, the most level and best ground for said road and the shortest distance.

SECTION 2. That the said company shall cause the said road to be made not less than forty nor more than sixty feet wide, and at least eighteen feet of which shall be artificial road. And the said company shall have like powers and privileges
