AN ACT

Authorizing the Wardens of the English Episcopal Church, in Huntingdon township, Adams county, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Thomas Stephens and Leonard Marsden, the present wardens of the English Episcopal church, in Huntingdon township, Adams county, (commonly known as Christ church) or their successors, be and they are hereby authorized to sell at public sale, to the highest and best bidder, the whole or any part or portion of the real estate, except the burial ground, now held in trust by said wardens, for the use of the officiating minister of said church, and his successors, and to convey and assure the same to the purchaser or purchasers, free and discharged, of the use aforesaid, by a good and sufficient deed or deeds of conveyance for the same. And the proceeds of such sale, after deducting all expenses attending the same, shall be invested by the said wardens jointly with the officiating minister of said church, who shall in the selection thereof, have an equal voice with the said wardens, in some permanent productive fund, as soon as may conveniently be done, and the interest or revenue arising from the same, shall be applied to and be and remain for the use of the said minister, and his successors in like manner as the proceeds of the said real estate is now limited and applied: *Provided,* That the principal of such investment shall ever remain untouched and unimpaired, and that the said wardens and officiating minister and their successors, may from time to time, as may

be necessary, change such investment, and invest the said fund anew.

SECTION 2. That John Gilpin, James E. Brown, and Alexander Johnston, and their associates, successors, and assigns, be and they are hereby constituted a body corporate, by the name, style and title, of the "Monteith iron company," for the transaction of the usual business of companies engaged in the mining of coal, and manufacturing iron, in all its various forms, and in making railroads for transporting the same to market, and the said company shall have the same capital, and all the rights, privileges, and powers of the "Bradford railroad and coal company," and be subject to all the provisions and restrictions imposed upon the said company, by the act incorporating the same, passed the twenty-eighth May, eighteen hundred and forty, entitled an act to incorporate the "Bradford railroad and coal company." The aforesaid John Gilpin, James E. Brown, and Alexander Johnston, and their associates, successors, and assigns, shall have power to hold by purchase or lease two thousand acres of land in each of the counties of Armstrong and Clarion, as also such lots of land, not exceeding five acres in any one place, as may be found convenient, as places of deposit in the transportation and sale of their produce; all notices required to be given in the act to which this act refers, shall be given in the county of Armstrong, by publication in one or more newspapers in said county, and the elections of the company shall be held in the borough of Kittanning, in said county; and it may be lawful for the said "Monteith iron company," to use and employ their moneys, lands, and tenements, in mining coal, making railroads to convey the same to market, in making and manufacturing iron from iron ore, into pig, bloom, or any other description of iron, and in such goods and merchandize as may be necessary to carry into full effect the operations of said company.

SECTION 3. That the commissioners of Greene county, are hereby authorized to make and execute a deed of conveyance to the Roman Catholic church, of Waynesburg, for about three fourths of an acre of ground, of the common of said town, to be laid off in a rectangular form, and on the east side of the present grave yard, and the north and south lines thereof to run with the north and south lines of the said present grave yard, which piece of ground shall be held by said church and their successors for ever, as a burial ground, and no indictment, suit or action in any form, shall be sustained to divest said church, or their successors, of the full and per-

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An act to Incorporate the Marietta, Bainbridge, Falmouth and Portsmouth road company."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That in addition to the privileges and power heretofore granted by the Commonwealth to the Marietta, Bainbridge, Falmouth and Portsmouth road company, by the act of April fifth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty, entitled, "An act to incorporate the Marietta, Bainbridge, Falmouth and Portsmouth turnpike road company," and the supplement to the same, entitled, "a further supplement to the act entitled an act incorporating the Marietta, Bainbridge, Falmouth and Portsmouth turnpike road company," the president and managers thereof are hereby authorized and empowered to extend the same railroad from the eastern end of the borough of Marietta to the canal basin at Columbia, and shall have full authority and privilege under the supervision and direction of the canal commissioners, there to unite the said extension of railroad with the Columbia and Philadelphia railroad.

SECTION 2. That in extending the said railroad from Marietta to Columbia, and also in the event of extending the same from the contemplated point of extension with the Portsmouth and Harrisburg railroad to Harrisburg, which extension the said company is hereby authorized to make, if such junction cannot be made with the consent of the Portsmouth and Lancaster railroad, the said company shall have like powers, authority and privileges granted to them, and shall be subject to the same restrictions, penalties, fines and forfeitures as are
