RESOLUTION

Relative to the Account of Joseph Mosher.

1. **RESOLVED**, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met*, That the auditor general of this Commonwealth be and he is hereby authorized and required, in the settlement of the account of Joseph Mosher, superintendent of the road to avoid the inclined plane at Columbia, to allow him a credit for interest paid by him on a contract made with A. G. Ralston and company, on the twenty-fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, for the purchase of railroad iron, spikes, and chairs for said road.

2. **RESOLVED**, That so much of the ninth section of an act entitled "An act to prevent the destruction of small insectivorous birds during their breeding time, and for the protection of game when out of season, in the county of Chester, and the township of Hellam in the county of York, and the township of Northampton in the county of Lehigh, and for other purposes," approved the twenty-sixth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, as relates to the number of votes each stockholder of the southern insurance company shall be entitled to for directors of said company, is hereby extended to the decision of all questions submitted for the consideration of the stockholders of said company, at their meetings of business. And the directors of said company be and they are hereby authorized, to make such by-laws as they may deem necessary for properly regulating and conducting the affairs of said company.
