## RESOLUTIONS

Relative to the Public Printing and Binding.

**RESOLVED**, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met*, That no report from any private corporation, other than those in which the State is a stockholder, shall be printed upon the journals. What may be

**RESOLVED**, That all legislative documents ordered to be printed by or reports made to both houses, be printed by one of the printers only under the direction of a joint committee hereinafter provided for. Joint commit-  
tee to regulate

**RESOLVED**, That the printers be directed in making out their bills, to furnish the number of ems of composition, and the number of tokens of press work which they may have performed, and that for the performance of the said work fifty cents per thousand ems, and fifty cents per token only shall be allowed. Printers ac-  
counts

**RESOLVED**, That one thousand copies of the English Journal proper of each house be printed, and one thousand copies of the remaining volumes containing the documents. English jour-  
nal

**RESOLVED**, That two hundred and fifty copies of the German Journal be printed in the form prescribed for the English Journal, and that the same compensation be allowed. German jour-  
nal

Joint committee—duties

RESOLVED, That a joint committee of three members of each house be appointed to superintend the printing.

Binding, price, &c

RESOLVED, That hereafter unless otherwise specially ordered by either house, the prices paid for folding, stitching, cutting, and covering the documents, pamphlets, and journals of either house, shall be at the rate of fifty cents per hundred copies, where the said pamphlet or document contains one sheet and no more; for any number of sheets more than one and not more than three, at the rate of seventy-five cents per hundred copies; for any number of sheets more than three and not more than seven, one dollar and twenty-five cents per hundred copies; and for every extra sheet over seven, twenty-five cents per hundred copies; extra for covers fifty cents per one hundred copies; for folding, cutting, stitching, and covering journals, at the rate of twenty cents per one hundred sheets.

## RESOLUTION

Granting the Trustees of the Lumberman's Bank further time to wind up its Affairs.

Powers of trustees to compound &c

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the provisions of the resolution of the twenty-fourth of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, in pursuance of which trustees were appointed to take charge of the Lumberman's Bank at Warren and wind up its affairs, be continued in force and extended to the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two. That the said trustees shall have the right to compound and compromise all debts of a doubtful character; to receive and allow by way of set off, the liabilities of said institution when tendered by any of the debtors; and to receive any property, stocks, or other securi-
