RESOLUTION

For the relief of Pennell, Lenher, and Humes, manufacturers of locomotive engines.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to pay to the firm of Pennell, Lenher, and Humes, manufacturers of locomotive engines, at the city of Lancaster, the amount due said firm for a locomotive engine, purchased by the canal commissioners, and now in use on the Philadelphia and Columbia railroad, out of the unexpended balance of an appropriation made by the act entitled "An act to provide for the repairs of the several lines of canal and railroad, and to continue the improvements of the state," passed the nineteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, to pay debts due for repairs, and for surveys which have been heretofore authorized, which debts may have been contracted prior to the first day of February, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.
