AN ACT

Supplementary to an act entitled "An act relative to the organization of Courts of Justice" passed the fourteenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the county of Lancaster is hereby annexed to the eastern district of the supreme court of Pennsylvania, and all process hereafter issued from the said court to the said county of Lancaster shall be returned to the said eastern district, and all and singular the records, papers and documents of the supreme court of the middle district connected with any cause removed thereto from the said county and remaining therein shall be removed to and deposited in the office of the prothonotary of the Supreme Court in the eastern district.

County of Lancaster annexed to eastern district of supreme court

SECTION 2. All causes and proceedings now depending and undetermined in the Supreme Court for the middle district removed or brought into the same, from the said county, shall be deemed to be depending before the said court in the eastern district, and shall be proceeded in by the said court, in like manner, as if they had been originally returned to the said court in the eastern district; and the Prothonotary of the Supreme Court for the eastern district shall collect and receive all fees which may have accrued in any cause or proceeding which by virtue of this act, shall be removed to the said district, and shall account for and pay the same when received to the persons respectively entitled thereto.

Causes removed from middle to eastern district

SECTION 3. The Judges of the Supreme Court shall prescribe by rule of court, certain days for the return of writs hereafter to be issued from the said court, to the county of Lancaster, conformably to the provisions of this act, and all writs heretofore thus issued and not yet returned shall be returned in the same manner.
