A N A C T

Relating to the claim of David Renno and Daniel Bentz, for apprehending two fugitives in the State of Ohio, and bringing them to this State.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be, and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to the said David Renno and Daniel Bentz the sum of two hundred dollars out of any money in the State Treasury not otherwise appropriated.

Supplementary to an act entitled "an act relating to the Lien of Mechanics and others upon buildings," passed the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provisions of the act entitled "an act relating to the lien of mechanics and others upon buildings," passed the sixteenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and also the provisions of the twenty-fourth section of an act entitled "an act to authorize the Governor to contract with the corporation of the borough of Harrisburg for supplying the public buildings with water and for other purposes," passed the twenty-eighth day of

April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, be and the same are hereby extended to Bradford and Monroe counties, and mechanics and others in said counties shall have like remedy under said act, as though they were herein enacted at full length.

The nineteenth section of the act entitled "an act granting certain powers to the authorities of the cities of Lancaster and Philadelphia, and for other purposes," passed the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, is hereby repealed, saving and reserving however, the rights of all persons to complete any proceedings begun under the same. AN ACT

Supplementary to an act entitled "an act to authorize the Pittsburg and Steubenville turnpike company, to change the location of their road in some instances, and to restrict the right of voting by proxy, and for other purposes," passed the fifteenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the above recited act as relates to changing the location of the turnpike from Pittsburg to Steubenville by the company, as lays between its eastern termination and John Oby's tavern, in Lower St. Clair township, Allegheny county, be and the same is hereby repealed.
