AN ACT

Regulating Election Districts and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act the township of Wayne, in the county of Clinton, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the western school house, in said township. Clinton county
Wayne township

SECTION 2. That the qualified voters of Crawford township, in the county of Clinton, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of George Gebhart, in said township. Crawford township

SECTION 3. That the qualified voters of Shrewsbury township, in the county of Lycoming, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Joel Bennett, in said township. Lycoming county

SECTION 4. That the qualified voters of Mifflin township, in the county of Lycoming, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Jacob Soladay, jr., in said township. Lycoming county

SECTION 5. That the qualified voters of the township of Green, in the county of Clinton, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at the house of Achenbach and Lott, in Logansville, in said township. Clinton county

SECTION 6. That the township of Muncy, in the county of Lycoming, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Britton Margargel, in said township. Lycoming county

SECTION 7. That the qualified voters of Logan township, in the county of Clinton, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections, at the house of Christian Grieb, in said township. Clinton county

SECTION 8. That the islands situated in the Susquehanna river, in the township of Conoy, in the county of Lancaster, shall hereafter be considered a part of said district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall vote at the usual place of holding elections therein. Lancaster county

SECTION 9. That the qualified voters of the township of Herford, in the county of Berks, shall hereafter hold their general elections, at the house of Michael Gehry, in said township. Berks county

Columbia county SECTION 10. That the qualified voters of the township of Orange, in the county of Columbia, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of George Seiple, in said township.

Venango county SECTION 11. That the township of Oakland, in the county of Venango, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general elections at the house of James R. McClintock, in said township.

Potter county SECTION 12. That the township of Clara, in the county of Potter, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general and township elections, at the house of Joseph C. Allen, in said township.

Potter co SECTION 13. That the township of Sharon, in the county of Potter, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general and township elections, at the house of Oliver C. Warner, in said township.

Crawford county SECTION 14. That after the next election the qualified voters of the township of Venango, in the county of Crawford, shall hold their general elections at the house of John Stoke, in said township, but the removal shall not be made from its present location, unless directed at the next election by a majority of the qualified electors.

Monroe county SECTION 15. That the qualified voters of Lower Smithfield township, in the county of Monroe, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of George Bush; innkeeper in said township.

Bedford county SECTION 16. That the qualified voters of the township of Bethel, in the county of Bedford, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the school house in Warfordsburg, in said township.

Adams county SECTION 17. That the qualified voters of the township of Mount Pleasant, in the county of Adams, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the school house near the cross roads, in said township.

Potter county SECTION 18. That the township of Genessee, in the county of Potter, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general elections at the house of Henry Sealz, in said township.

Greene county SECTION 19. That the township of Perry, in the county of Green, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of John B. Minor, in said township.

Tioga county SECTION 20. That the township of Bloss, in the county of Tioga, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at Boyd's hotel, in the village of Blossburg, in said township.

SECTION 21. That the township of Banks, in the county of Northampton, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the house occupied by Peter G. Gensel, in said township. Northampton
county

SECTION 22. That the qualified voters of the thirty-third election district of the county of Lancaster, being a portion of the township of Strasburg, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Robert Evans, in the borough of Strasburg. Lancaster
county

SECTION 23. That the township of Conemaugh, in the county of Cambria, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and elect their own township officers, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general elections at the public school house number thirteen, in said township. Cambria
county

SECTION 24. That the qualified voters of the township of Morris, in the county of Clearfield, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Josiah Hunter, at Morrisdale, in said township. Clearfield

SECTION 25. That the qualified voters of the township of Ross, in the county of Luzerne, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the centre school house, in said township. Luzerne

SECTION 26. That the township of Penn, in the county of Berks, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof, shall hold their general elections at the house now occupied by Daniel Pottelger, in said township. Berks

SECTION 27. That the qualified voters residing in the township of Upper Bern, in the county of Berks, who formerly voted in the Bernville district, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the place where the said elections are held in the township of Upper Bern. Berks

SECTION 28. That the citizens residing north of the Susquehanna Avenue, as is now laid down in the survey of Penn township, in the county of Philadelphia, shall on the third Friday of March next, and annually thereafter, hold their township elections for constable, school directors, and other township officers, at the public house of Enoch Keizel, sign of the wagon and horses, at the corner of the township line road and Nicetown lane, in said township. SECTION 29. That so much of the second resolution as relates to incorporated Penn township, in the county of Philadelphia, passed the eighteenth day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty, and all other acts inconsistent with this supplementary act, be and the same is hereby repealed. Philadelphia

SECTION 30. That the qualified voters of Rockdale township, in the county of Crawford, shall hereafter hold their Crawford co

general elections at the centre school house, at Miller's four corners, in said township.

SECTION 31. That the township of Lake, in the county of Luzerne, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their elections at the outlet of Harvey Lake school house, in said township.

SECTION 32. That the qualified voters of the township of Lower Salford, in the county of Montgomery, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Jonas Boorse, inn-keeper, in said township.

SECTION 33. That the qualified voters of the township of Muddy creek, in the county of Butler, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the Town Hall, in Portersville.

SECTION 34. That the general and township elections of Wheatfield township, in the county of Perry, shall hereafter be held at centre school house, in said township.

SECTION 35. That so much of the act of the nineteenth March, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, and its supplement passed the nineteenth January, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, entitled "An act erecting the village of Fallstown, in the county of Beaver, into a borough," as relates to the election of two supervisors in said borough, be and the same is hereby repealed. And all the duties and powers of said supervisors be vested in a street commissioner, to be appointed by the town council of said borough.

SECTION 36. That so much of the eighty-first section of the act of the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, relating to counties and townships, and county and township officers, as requires the election of supervisors for three years, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as respects Metal township, in Franklin county. And the election of said officers in said township, shall be annually, and when elected, shall perform the duties and be subject to the same responsibilities provided in the said act of the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four.

SECTION 37. That the eleventh section of the act entitled "An act relating to the election of county treasurers, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-seventh day of May, eighteen hundred and forty-one, as prohibits the appointment of an assessor or assistant assessor to the office of collector of taxes, be and the same is hereby repealed, excepting the city and county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 38. That the portion of East Hempfield township, in the county of Lancaster, included within the following bounds, viz: beginning at the north east corner of Manor township, thence up the Little Conestoga creek to the fork of the same, thence up the west branch thereof generally called

Swar's or Kauffman's creek, to Hershey's fulling mill, thence along the same to the line of Manor township, thence along the same to the place of beginning, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the public school house, in the village of Hempfield, in said township.

SECTION 39. That the general and township elections of the township of Manallin, in the county of Fayette, shall hereafter be held at the house of Robert Hunter in said township. Fayette co

SECTION 40. That the township of Covington, in the county of Clearfield is hereby erected into a separate election district, and that the qualified voters of said township shall hold their general and township elections at the house of Jacob Maurer, in said township. Clearfield co

SECTION 41. That so much of the eighty-fifth section of the act of the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, relating to counties and townships, and county and township officers, as requires the election of three supervisors is hereby repealed, so far as it relates to the county of Luzerne, and it shall be the duty of the electors of the several townships in the said county, (except the township of Falls) annually to elect, on the day specified by law, two supervisors, who shall serve for the space of one year, and shall perform the duties, and be subject to the responsibilities provided by the act entitled "An act relating to counties and townships, and county and township officers," passed the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four. SECTION 42. So much of the said act as enjoins on the supervisors the duties of overseers of the poor, is hereby repealed, so far as the same relates to the county of Luzerne, and it shall be the duty of the electors of the several townships in said county, annually at the time and place of electing supervisors, to elect two persons who shall perform the duties of overseers of the poor for one year, and be subject to the duties and responsibilities provided by the act entitled "An act relating to counties and townships, and county and township officers," passed the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four. SECTION 43. The qualified voters of the township of Falls, in the county of Luzerne, shall annually elect twelve supervisors of the highways, to serve for the period of one year, and the said supervisors shall within one month after the election, divide the said township into twelve districts, so as to include one of the said supervisors in each district, and the supervisor residing in that district shall have the control and direction of the highways therein, and lay out and expend the money raised from taxes within such district. SECTION 44. The qualified voters in the said township of Falls, may annually decide by ballot, at the time and place of the election of supervisors, whether the road tax in said township shall exceed the amount now authorized to be levied by law: *Provided*, That the sum to be assessed shall not exceed the sum of six hundred dollars in any one year, and the ballots voted shall contain the number of hundred of dollars to be raised, and if there shall be a majority in favor of increasing the tax, that amount shall be assessed by the supervisors for which there is a majority of votes cast, but in no event shall the sum be less than the amount now required by law to be levied, and the said supervisors shall each receive the sum of fifty cents for every day occupied in his working on the highways.

SECTION 45. The division to be made of the said township by this law, shall be reduced to writing, certified and signed by all the said commissioners, and placed in the hands of the township auditors for safe keeping, and shall describe the boundaries of each division or district. In all elections hereafter, each district shall have one supervisor, and all tax levied on persons or property therein, shall be expended in said district, unless a majority of the whole number of supervisors shall otherwise direct, and for this purpose two or more of the supervisors may call a meeting of the whole number, and if in the opinion of a majority of them, any one district may require more money to keep the roads therein in good repair, than the tax levied will amount to, in that case they shall name the sum to be taken from each of the others, and their proceedings shall be entered at large in the book of the town clerk.

SECTION 46. The election of the supervisors and the overseers of the poor, shall be returned as now required by law, to the court of quarter sessions in the said county, as also the vote on the increase of taxes, and the said court is hereby empowered to make any order or decree that may be deemed just and proper, either to order and direct a new election, if necessary, or to examine and decide upon the returns. In the event it is necessary to direct another vote to be taken, they shall name the time and the notice, and the manner in which the same shall be given, and by whom, and the order or confirmation of the said court shall be final and conclusive, without appeal or writ of error.

SECTION 47. That the township of Lancaster, in the county of Lancaster, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by Jacob Peters, as a wagon-maker shop, on the Millerstown road, in said township.

SECTION 48. That the qualified voters of the township of Lower Mahanoy, in the county of Northumberland, shall here- North'd co
after hold their general and township elections at the house of Jacob Spotz, in said township.

SECTION 49. That the qualified electors of the township of Dickenson, in the county of Cumberland, be and they are Cumberland
hereby authorized to hold their general elections at the house of Philip Weaver, in said township.

SECTION 50. That the qualified voters of the township of Pittston, in Luzerne county, shall hereafter hold their town- Luzerne co
ship and general elections at the Pittston Free School House, in said township.

SECTION 51. That the township of Standing-Stone, in the county of Bradford, shall hereafter form a separate election Bradford
district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the house of Peter C. Ward, in said township.

SECTION 52. That the qualified voters of South Woodbury township, in Bedford county, be hereby authorized and Bedford
directed to hold their general election at Potter's Mill, in said township.

SECTION 53. That the general, township and borough elec-
tions, in the township of Shirley, in the county of Huntingdon, Huntingdon
be held at the house now occupied by David Traker, in the borough of Shirleysburg.

SECTION 54. That the qualified voters of the borough of Harrisburg, at their election for borough officers, shall elect Harrisburg
three auditors annually, who shall audit and settle the accounts of the receipts and expenditures of said borough, and in the performance of their duties have the same powers as are possessed by county auditors, and receive like compensation, to require the attendance of witnesses, and to administer oaths. Said auditors shall meet on the second Monday of April next, and at such other times as they may find necessary in the performance of the duties required of them by law, at the chamber of the council of said borough, and shall audit, settle and adjust the receipts and expenditures of said borough, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, and thereafter annually on the first Monday of January of each year, and at such other times as aforesaid; and shall audit, settle and adjust the receipts and expenditures of said borough for the preceeding year; said accounts shall be acted and reported on as accounts of county officers are by law authorized to be settled and reported, and shall be subject to like appeal, issue and judgment, which account, when so settled, the auditors shall cause to be published at the expense of said borough in two or more newspapers published therein, in a manner similar to that of the annual accounts of the county commissioners and treasurer; also an account of debts due by said borough,

and to whom, and such other information as may tend to give general information of the state of said borough.

SECTION 55. That part of Madison township, in Perry county, known as Henry's Valley, shall hereafter hold their general elections with the citizens of Tyrone township.

Susquehanna
county

SECTION 56. That the qualified voters of Franklin township, Susquehanna county, shall hereafter hold their general election at the Centre School House, in said township, near the house of Jacob Allard.

Clinton co

SECTION 57. That hereafter the general election for the district composed of the township of Grove, in the county of Clinton, shall be held at the house of William Floyd, junior, at the first Fork of the Sinnemahoning, in said township.

Bedford co

SECTION 58. That the qualified voters of the township of Harrison, in the county of Bedford, shall hereinafter hold their general election at the house of John Metzgar, in said township.

City Pittsb'g

SECTION 59. That the select and common councils of the city of Pittsburg, shall hereafter have power and authority to fix the place of holding all elections for inspector and other ward officers, at such houses within the bounds of the respective wards and not elsewhere, as they may designate and change the same as public convenience may require.

Allegheny co

SECTION 60. That the borough of Sharpsburg, in the county of Allegheny, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the Temperance House now occupied by James Sharp, in said borough.

Franklin co

SECTION 61. That so much of the eighty-first section of the act of the fifteenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An Act relating to counties and townships, and county and township officers," as requires the election of three supervisors and a township treasurer, is hereby repealed, so far as it applies to the county of Franklin, and it shall be the duty of the electors of every township, annually to elect two supervisors, who shall serve for the term of one year, and shall perform the duties and be subject to the responsibilities provided by the act to which this section is a supplement.

SECTION 62. That the qualified voters of the township of Union, in Luzerne county, shall hereafter hold their township and general elections at Mavin's School House, in said township.

Somerset co

SECTION 63. That the electors of Summit township, in the county of Somerset, shall hold their township and general elections at the School House near Myer's Mills, and Elias K. Bleghey, Jacob P. Walker and Samuel Miller, are hereby appointed and authorized to hold said elections, until others

shall be elected for that purpose, under the general law regulating elections; the said officers hereby appointed, to have all the powers, and be subject to all the penalties imposed on such officers by the laws of this Commonwealth, in such cases made and provided.

SECTION 64. That the township of West Hanover, in the county of Dauphin, shall, as now divided into three separate election districts, hereafter form three separate townships and school districts, the south district shall be called "South Hanover," and the electors of said township shall hold their township elections at the house of Philip Wolfersberger, in said township; the east district shall be called "East Hanover," and the west district "West Hanover," and the electors of the respective townships shall hold their respective township elections at the houses they now respectively hold their general elections at, in said townships; and the common school system shall be continued in each of said districts until the second Tuesday of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three; justices of the peace elected to the office in said township prior to the passage of this act, shall continue to hold and exercise their respective offices for the time they respectively were elected, and in the township in which they may respectively happen to reside by the present division; and the present supervisors shall file in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions of Dauphin county, as the dividing line of said townships, the survey and draft thereto annexed of the election lines run of said West Hanover township, pursuant to law, by M. Robeson, on the seventeenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight. Notice of the elections to be held in each of said townships, on the third Friday in March next, shall be given by the present constable, supervisors or assessors, in the manner directed by law for single townships.

SECTION 65. That the qualified voters of the township of Minorsville, in the county of Schuylkill, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of John Moon, in said township.

SECTION 66. That hereafter the duties of the assessors of the several townships, incorporated districts and boroughs in this Commonwealth shall terminate on the day after the holding of the general elections, at which time the duties of the assessors elected at the preceding township, incorporated district and borough elections shall commence.

SECTION 67. That the qualified voters of that part of East Earl township, in the county of Lancaster, composing the the thirty seventh election district of said county, shall hereafter hold their township elections at the public house of Henry Yundt, in said district; and the said elections shall be opened

and conducted in all respects as if it was a separate township election district and the judges of each township election for township officers in said township shall meet within twenty-four hours after closing said election at the public house now occupied by George Harkey, in the village of New Holland, and then and there carefully add up the votes given at both township elections, and proceed in making out returns and certificates as is now by law provided.

Lancaster co SECTION 68. That the township of East Lampeter, in the county of Lancaster, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general, special and township elections at the house now occupied by Philip Ferree, in said township.

Lancaster co SECTION 69. That any two of the judges of the court of quarter sessions of said county, shall appoint a proper person constable of said township of East Lampeter, and require the same security as is now directed by law as to constables, and who shall continue in office until the third Friday in March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, or until a successor be duly qualified, and do and perform all the duties now required by law of constables.

Lancaster co SECTION 70. That the qualified voters of said township of East Lampeter, shall on the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, between the hours of eight and ten o'clock in the forenoon, at the house of Philip Ferree, as aforesaid, select from the citizens present, one person to serve as judge, and two persons as inspectors of the township election to be held on that day, who shall have, and exercise all the powers and duties of judges and inspectors of elections, chosen under the law now in force.

Lancaster co SECTION 71. That the qualified voters of said township may, at any township election hereafter holden, vote to change the place of holding said township elections, ten days previous notice being given by the township constable.

Lancaster co SECTION 72. That two justices of the peace shall be elected for the said township, at the time of electing constables, in the mode and manner prescribed by, and under the provisions of the act of twenty-first June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, entitled "An act providing for the election of aldermen and justices of the peace.

Lancaster co SECTION 73. That the qualified voters of West Lampeter township, in Lancaster county, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the public house now occupied by Henry Miller, in the Village of Lampeter Square.

Clarion co SECTION 74. That the township of Limestone, in the county of Clarion, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the Union School House, in the village of Greenville, in said township.

SECTION 75. That the township of Penn Forest, in the county of Monroe, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the house now occupied by Josiah M. Pratt, in said township. Monroe co

SECTION 76. That the qualified voters of the township of Codorus, in the county of York, shall hereafter hold their general elections at Wolfram's tavern, at the intersection of the road leading from York to Manchester, and that from Jefferson to Baltimore, in said township. York co

SECTION 77. The qualified electors of Antis township, in Huntingdon county, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public school house, on the land owned by John Bell, in said township. Huntingdon county

SECTION 78. That the township of Snyder, in the county of Huntingdon, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general and township elections at the school house, in said township, known as the Bald Eagle School House. Huntingdon county

SECTION 79. That hereafter the qualified voters of the borough of Jersey Shore, shall hold their borough elections on the third Friday of February in each and every year. Jersey Shore borough

SECTION 80. That the citizens of Sadsbery township, Crawford county, shall at the next township election be authorized to elect two additional justices of the peace, and one additional constable; and an election shall be held at the same time and place for "increase of justices," and if a majority of the qualified voters of said township consent to the increase of justices, those returns for the increase of justices, those returns for the election of justices, and those returns for the election of constables, shall be transmitted to the Governor agreeably to an act providing for the election of aldermen and justices of the peace, but not otherwise; said election for increase of justices to be conducted agreeably to said act. Crawford co

SECTION 81. That the elections in Carroll township, Washington county, shall hereafter be held at the double school house, in Monongahela city instead of Mr. Hamilton's Hotel. Washington county

SECTION 82. That the qualified voters of Union township, Berks county, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Herman Umstead, in said township. Berks co

SECTION 83. That the qualified voters of the township of Hellam, in the county of York, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at Rudy's and Stoner's School House, on the York and Susquehanna turnpike road, in said township. York co

SECTION 84. That from and after the passage of this act, in all township elections of this Commonwealth, for judges of the general and township elections where a tie shall exist in the elections Township

said election of judges. The inspector who shall have the highest number of votes, in said election, shall appoint a judge for that purpose.

Bucks co X SECTION 85. That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the qualified electors of Upper Makefield township, in the county of Bucks, to elect one supervisor, in addition to the number, to which they were heretofore entitled by law, at the same time and place, and in the manner that constables, supervisors, and other township officers are elected in said township.

York co SECTION 86. That the qualified voters of Paradise township, in the county of York, shall hereafter hold their general elections, at such place as shall be agreed upon at their spring election, on the third Friday of March next, ensuing by a majority of the voters of said township.

Allegheny co SECTION 87. That the qualified voters of the borough of Birmingham, in the county of Allegheny, shall hereafter hold their general and borough elections at the public school house, in said borough.

York co SECTION 88. That the qualified voters of township Conewago, the county of York, shall hereafter hold their general elections at the house of Frederick Hake, innkeeper, in said township.

**Borough of
Newton
Bucks county** SECTION 89. That the election of borough officers as provided for in the sixteenth section of the act, incorporating the borough of Newton, in Bucks county, passed the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty eight, shall hereafter be held on the third Friday in March, instead of the third Monday of May, and that the quarterly meetings of the town council, shall be held on the third Friday in March, June, September and December annually.

Same SECTION 90. The town council shall have power to supply all vacancies that may occur in the office of chief burgess, assistant burgess, town council, high constable, or any other officer of said corporation, occasioned by death, resignation, removal, tie vote or otherwise, and chief burgess, or assistant burgess, for the collection of the borough taxes, may direct his precept to either the high constable, or some other suitable person at his discretion, whose duty it shall be, as well as all other borough officers, to render their accounts to the town council annually on the second Friday in March.

Same SECTION 91. It shall be the duty of the chief burgess, or the assistant burgess, or either of them, to publish a statement of the finances of the borough annually, as well as all the ordinances that may be enacted by the council, by six written or printed hand bills, put up in as many of the most public places in said borough, giving at least three weeks notice before the said ordinances can take effect, or by publishing the same three weeks in the paper published in the borough.

SECTION 92. That all the provisions of the original act, incorporating the borough of Newton, Bucks county, is hereby altered or supplied, so far they are inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed. Same

SECTION 95. That the township of Karthaus, in Clearfield county, is hereby erected into a separate election district, and the qualified voters of said township, shall hold their general and special elections at the frame house, used as a boarding-house, at Karthaus Iron Works, in said township, being the same house at which the election was held when said township formed part of Covington township, in said county. SECTION 96. That the township of North Coventry, in the county of Chester, shall hereafter form a separate election district, and the electors hold their general and township elections, at the Halcyon school house, in said township. Chester co

SECTION 97. That so much of the fifth section of the act, passed March twenty-eight, one thousand eight hundred and twenty, entitled "a further supplement to an act, entitled an act to amend and consolidate with its supplements, the act entitled an act, for the recovery of debts and demands, not exceeding one hundred dollars, before a justice of the peace, and for the election of constables, and for other purposes," as prohibits any person to serve as constable more than two years, in any term of three years," be and the same is hereby repealed, as to South Whitehall township, in the county of Lehigh.
