AN ACT

In relation to the Theological Seminary at Canonsburg.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the 5th section of the act, passed the 8th day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-three, entitled "An act to incorporate the Theological Seminary, at Canonsburg, in the county of Washington, belonging to the Synod of the Associate Presbyterian Church," as limits the clear yearly value or income of the messuages, houses, lands and tenements rents, annuities or other hereditaments, and real estate of said Theological Seminary, and the interest of money to the sum of five hundred pounds, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Repealing former act relative to income

SECTION 2. The trustees of said Theological Seminary are hereby authorized and empowered to purchase, take, hold and enjoy in trust for said Seminary, any and all manner of messuages, houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities or other hereditaments, and real and personal property, and money, which has been heretofore, or may hereafter be given, granted or bequeathed to said Seminary, or to any person in trust, therefor the clear annual value or income of which shall not exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars.
