

SECTION 4. That the officers enumerated by this act, shall be chosen by ballot at a general meeting of the said horse company, on the last Saturday of December annually, to continue in office for one year, or until their successors be elected. Election

SECTION 5. That the funds of this company, shall be exclusively appropriated to the payment of rewards offered for, and the expenses incurred in detecting horse thieves, and recovering stolen horses, and defraying the necessary costs attending the meetings of the company. Funds

SECTION 6. That the company shall have power at any general meeting, to make such by-laws, as may be deemed necessary for its better regulation: *Provided*, That such by-laws are not repugnant to, or inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this state, or of the United States. By-laws

SECTION 7. That the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul the charter at any time hereafter. Legislative reservation

## AN ACT

For the relief of David Gring and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay unto David Gring, of Berks county, Sarah Jefferies, of the city of Baltimore; Chambers Gaw, of Lancaster county, Ann Catharine Wann, of Lebanon county, Alexander Scott, of Westmoreland county, and Helen Elizabeth Hibler, and Catharine Nunnemacher, of Northampton county, and James Gallaher, of Clearfield county, soldiers, and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Relief in Bk's

SECTION 4. That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay unto Jacob Carle, of Berks county, and Joseph Rher, of Schuylkill county, and Henry Seling, of Fayette county, or their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity in full for military services rendered by them, during the revolutionary and Indian wars; the forgoing pensions and gratuities to be paid in conformity to existing laws.

SECTION 5. That the State Treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required, to pay to Robert Maxwell, of Harrison county, state of Ohio, formerly of Washington county, Pennsylvania, a soldier of the revolutionary war, or to his order, forty dollars, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars during his life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.
