AN ACT

Supplementary to an act entitled "An act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a general system of education by Common Schools," and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* The county commissioners of this Commonwealth, shall upon demand, furnish the school directors of each accepting district, with a correct copy of the last adjusted valuation of all property in their respective school districts, subject to taxation for school purposes, and so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as conflicts with the provision of this section is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2. That all that part of school district number one, in Perry township, Jefferson county, lying south of Big Mahoning creek in said county, shall hereafter form a separate school district, to be called Whitesville, which said district shall be subject to, and receive all the benefits from the laws now in force relative to common schools.

SECTION 3. That until the directors of any accepting school district in this state, make a report as required by the seventh section of the act, of the thirteenth of June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and the second section of the supplement thereto, passed twenty-first April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, entitled "An act to consolidate and amend the several acts relative to a general system of education by Common Schools," the superintendent of common schools shall not deliver to said directors or to the district, any order upon the State Treasurer for the money belonging to the district, for this nor any succeeding year, but in all cases before an order issues the report from the district shall be made to the proper officer: *Provided,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the issuing of orders to directors of new accepting districts as heretofore.
