## AN ACT

To authorize the citizens of Little Beaver township, in the county of Beaver, to elect two additional Supervisors of the highways, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified electors of Little Beaver township, in the county of Beaver, shall hereafter elect two additional supervisors of the highways, to the number which may now be elected annually, at the usual time and place appointed by law, for the election of supervisors for the several townships of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 2. That the qualified electors of Chippewa township, in the county of Beaver, shall hereafter elect one additional supervisor of the highways, to the number which may now be elected annually, at the usual time and place appointed by law, for the election of supervisors for the several townships of this Commonwealth.

SECTION 3. That so much of the law allowing premiums for the destruction of Foxes, Wolves and Wild Cats, as relates to Butler county, is hereby repealed; and that hereafter all views for the division of townships, or the alteration of township lines, and views and reviews of roads of every description in the said county, shall be paid by the petitioners, and in no case by the said county.

SECTION 4. That from and after the third Friday in March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, it shall not be lawful for any of the commissioners of the incorporated districts, within the county of Philadelphia, to exercise the duties of school directors and commissioners at the same time.

SECTION 5. The term of office of any county treasurer, who may be hereafter elected by the qualified voters of the counties of Bucks and Montgomery, in pursuance of the act of Assembly, passed the twenty-seventh day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act relating to the election of county treasurers, and for other purposes," shall expire and be determined at the expiration of one year from the first Monday of January next, after his election, and that on the second Tuesday of October, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, an election of treasurers of said counties shall take place; and that the election of said officer shall take

place annually thereafter, on the second Tuesday of October, in each and every year, and that so much of the first section of the said act as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed so far as regards the counties of Bucks and Montgomery.

**SECTION 6.** That it shall be the duty of any person or persons offering dry measures for sale, within the limits of the city and county of Philadelphia, to have the same stamped and sealed by the proper officer of said city and county, and any person found guilty of offering or exposing for sale any dry measure without having the same sealed and adjusted by the proper officer as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty of five dollars for every such offence, to be collected as debts of like amount are now collected, one half to go to the informer, and the other half to the use of said county, and so much of any laws of this Commonwealth as are hereby altered or supplied, be and the same are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 7.** That the supervisors of Fallowfield township, Washington county, be authorized to levy an additional tax to pay the debts of said township now existing and no more.

**SECTION 8.** That the citizens of Sadsbury township, Crawford county, shall have authority to elect one additional surpervisor in said township.

**SECTION 9.** That the act supplementary to an act granting certain powers to the authorities of the cities of Lancaster and Philadelphia, and for other purposes, passed the sixteenth day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and extended to the county of Chester, the twenty-seventh day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, as relates to letting out the public roads by contract, by the supervisors of the several townships, in the county of Chester, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as relates to the township of West Grove, in said county.

**SECTION 10.** That so much of the act of the Legislature, passed the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and all the supplements thereto, as relates to roads and highways in the county of Delaware, entitled "An act granting certain powers to the authorities of the cities of Lancaster and Philadelphia, and for other purposes," be and the same is hereby repealed from and after the passage of this act, so far as relates to the townships of Lower Chichester, Birmingham and Radnor, in the said county of Delaware.

**SECTION 11.** That on the third Tuesday in March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two and annually thereafter, the election for chief burgess, assistant burgess, high constable and members of the council of the borough of Lebanon, shall be held during the same hours, and by the persons

appointed to hold the election for inspectors and assessors under the act, entitled "An act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth," passed the second day of July, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and that so much of the act to which this is a supplement, as is hereby altered or supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. That the township of Woodward, in the county of Clinton, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and the qualified voters thereof shall hold their general elections at the public house of Nathaniel Hanna, now in the occupancy of Robert M. Hanna, in said township. Clinton co

SECTION 13. That the township of Sugar, in the county of Huntingdon, shall hereafter be a separate election district, and hold their elections at the public school house in said township. Huntingdon

SECTION 14. The qualified electors of the township of Manchester, in the county of York, are hereby authorized to vote, and the inspectors are required to receive at the general election to be held on the second Tuesday of October next, a ticket on which shall be printed or written, the names of the place at which they desire, that the general elections for said township shall be held thereafter, and should a majority decide in favor of a place other than the court house, in the borough of York, the said township of Manchester, shall thereafter constitute a separate election district, and the elections shall be held at such place as the majority shall have selected, as is provided for in the first part of this section, and the sheriff of York county, is hereby required to embody this section in his next annual proclamation, for holding the general election in said county. SECTION 15. That James Lyon be and he is hereby authorized and directed to sell certain lots, situate in the town of Beaver, in the county of Beaver, and numbered in the general plan of said town, one hundred and twenty-five, one hundred and twenty-six, and one hundred and twenty-seven, at public sale at such time and place, as he the said James Lyon shall fix, having first given public notice of the time and place of sale to be published in two weekly newspapers, in the said county of Beaver, for eight weeks successively before the day of sale; and also giving notice as aforesaid to the heirs and legal representatives of Henderson C. Hall, deceased, to appear on or before the day of sale, and pay to him the said James Lyon, the balance of the purchase money due the Commonwealth on said lots. James Lyons

SECTION 16. That in case the residue of the purchase money shall not be paid by the heirs and legal representatives of the said Henderson C. Hall, the sale made to the purchaser under the provisions of the foregoing section, shall vest in the Purchase  
money

purchaser, his heirs and assigns a valid title, against the Commonwealth, and all and every person or persons whomsoever, claiming title under the same, and upon a return made by the said James Lyon, of the balance of the purchase money due, and the name or names of the purchaser or purchasers, and the number of the lot or lots purchased by each, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall issue patents to the purchasers for the same.

SECTION 17. That the said James Lyon shall retain the costs and expenses of affecting the aforesaid sale, and the amount due the Commonwealth, and pay the overplus if any remain, to the legal representatives of Henderson C. Hall, deceased, in such proportions as they are entitled to receive the same, according to the number and value of the lots claimed by them respectively under a former sale.

SECTION 18. That the titles of Banner Thomas and Samuel F. Reed, respectively of, in and to a certain lot or piece of ground, situate on the south side of Prime street, between Ninth and Tenth streets, in the township of Moyamensing, and county of Philadelphia, containing in front or breadth on the south side of Prime street, one hundred and sixty-four feet or thereabouts, and in length or depth-southward from the south side of Prime street, on the west line thereof two hundred and fifty-three feet four inches, and on the east line thereof two hundred and sixty feet, be and the same are hereby confirmed and the said Banner Thomas and Samuel F. Reed, shall respectively have, hold and enjoy one equal undivided half part of the said lot or piece of ground, in fee as tenants in common, and not as joint tenants, as fully and effectually as if Bernard Cooker, devisee of Jacob Cooker, deceased, and assignor of the said lot or piece of ground to Hugh O'Donnell had joined with his wife Agnes Cooker, in a certain deed dated March third, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, by which deed she conveyed, or intended to convey, all her right, title, interest, property, claim or demand of, in and to the said lot or piece of ground, unto the said Banner Thomas, his heirs and assigns in fee.
