AN ACT

Authorizing the trustees of "The First Independent Church of Christ, commonly called Universalists, meeting in their house of public worship, in Lombard street, in the city of Philadelphia," to convey all their estate to the said corporation, and to change the name thereof.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the trustees of "The First Independent Church of Christ, commonly called Universalists, meeting in their house of public worship, in Lombard street, in the city of Philadelphia," or a majority of them, be and they are hereby authorized to convey, assign and transfer unto the said corporation, its successors and assigns, all the estate, real, personal and mixed, vested in said trustees, for the use of the said corporation, and on the said conveyance and transfer being made as aforesaid, the said corporation shall be deemed vested with all and every the rights, powers, authority and privileges of the said trustees.

Name changed

SECTION 2. That the name and title of the said corporation is hereby altered and changed to "The First Universalist Church," and by this latter name and title, the said corporation shall have and exercise all the rights, privileges, powers and authorities of its former title.
