A N A C T

For the relief of the Children of David Long, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall and may be lawful for the court of common pleas, of Lancaster county, on the application of the committee of the person and estate of David Long, a Lunatic of said county, to make an order authorizing the said committee to pay to any of the children of the said David Long, whether they be sole or covert, and notwithstanding their coverture, such portion or portions of the trust moneys belonging to the estate of the said lunatic, as the said court shall deem reasonable and proper, for the purpose of their maintenance or furtherance in life and business, and the said court shall and may allow, and confirm any payments such as aforesaid, heretofore made by the said committee, if in the opinion of the said court, such payments were reasonable and proper; and all such payments, so authorized or confirmed, shall be considered as advancements made to the said children respectively, in the lifetime of the said David Long, and upon his death, the same together with lawful interest from the date of such payments respectively, shall be deducted from the share or shares of the estate of the said Lunatic, to which they, their heirs, executors, administrators or assigns, may respectively become entitled, either by will or under the intestate laws of this commonwealth.

SECTION 2. That the trustees of the Lancaster county bank, for the time being, appointed in conformity with the provisions of the act, entitled "An act to incorporate the Lancaster county bank, passed May fourth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, or a majority of them, shall have power and authority to enter satisfaction upon the record of any mortgage executed, or which may be hereafter executed by any present or future stockholders of said bank, upon any real estate belonging to such stockholder, and to release the same from the effects of such mortgage upon such stockholder executing a mortgage on any other tract or parcel of real estate, situate in the county of Lancaster, in like manner upon the same

conditions, and for the same purposes contemplated and expressed in the act incorporating the said Lancaster county bank, and the said property, when so mortgaged, shall be liable to all the provisions of the said act, as fully and effectually, and to all intents and purposes as if the same had been originally mortgaged, for the amount of stock held by such stockholder mortgaging the same: *Provided*, That in all such cases the valuation shall be the same as is required in and by the same act of incorporation, and the trustees aforesaid, shall be satisfied that such property so mortgaged, is sufficient at the valuation to "own" the whole amount of stock owned and held by the person executing such mortgage.

A N A C T

To establish a new Judicial District out of the counties of Huntingdon, Centre, Mifflin, Clearfield, Union and Clinton.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That from and after the first day of May next, the counties of Huntingdon, Mifflin and Union, shall be, and they hereby are erected and formed into a separate judicial district, to be called the twentieth district, and a person of integrity learned in the law, shall be appointed and commissioned by the Governor, to be President Judge of the courts of common pleas within the said district, which said president shall receive the like salary and have and execute all and singular the powers, jurisdictions and authorities of president and judge of the court of common pleas, court of oyer and terminer, general jail delivery, orphans' court, and justice of the court of quarter sessions of the peace, agreeably to the constitution and laws of this Commonwealth.
