AN ACT

To vacate that part of the Columbia Avenue, in the county of Philadelphia, as lies between the river Delaware and the west side of Sixth street, from said river, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That that part of Columbia avenue, which lies between the river Delaware and the west side of Sixth street, from said river, as confirmed by the court of general quarter sessions of the county of Philadelphia, one hundred feet wide, and running from the said river Delaware to the river Schuylkill, through the districts of Kensington and unincorporated Penn Township, as laid down in the plans or revised plans made by the commissioners to make a survey in the districts of Spring Garden, Northern Liberties and Kensington, be, and the same is hereby vacated.

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SECTION 2. That so much of the ninth section of the act of the general assembly of this commonwealth, passed the first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven, entitled "An Act relating to the borough of Uniontown, Fayette county, and for other purposes," and all other laws and decrees confirming so much of said Columbia avenue, as lies between the said river Delaware, and the west side of said Sixth street, be, and the same is hereby repealed.
