SECTION 16. So much of the act to which this is a supplement, and the various acts amendatory thereof, as are hereby altered or amended, or are inconsistent herewith, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To repeal so much of a certain act as authorizes the election of additional Justices of the Peace, on the thirty-first March, eighteen hundred and forty-three.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the act, entitled "An Act authorizing the election of an additional justice of the peace, in the borough of Greensburg, in the county of Westmoreland, and for other purposes," passed the seventh day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-three, as authorizes the election of additional justices of the peace, on the thirty-first of March, eighteen hundred and forty-three, is hereby repealed; and the election of such additional justices shall be held at the time and places of holding the elections for constables, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-four, in cases where a decision shall have been made in favor of such increase of justices.
