AN ACT

For the relief of Thomazin Gray.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and required to pay to Thomazin Gray of Chester county, or her order, an annuity of forty dollars, to be paid half yearly, commencing on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and to continue for five years, as a full compensation for all injuries sustained by the said Thomazin Gray on the Philadelphia and Columbia railroad.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Rescue fire company of the borough of Honesdale, in the county of Wayne.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every person that shall at the time of the passing of this act be members of the association called the "Rescue fire company of Honesdale," shall be Name and they are hereby declared to be a body politic and corpo-

rate in law, by the name, style and title of the "Rescue fire company of Honesdale," and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded, in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to take, receive and hold all and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments which may at any time or times heretofore have been granted, bargained, sold, enfeoffed, released, devised or otherwise conveyed to the said Rescue fire company of Honesdale, or to any person or persons for their use, or in trust for them; and the same lands and tenements, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments are hereby vested and established in the said corporation; and their successors are hereby declared to be seized and possessed of such estate or estates herein as in and by the respective grants, bargains, sales, enfeoffments, releases, devises or other conveyances thereof is or are declared limited and expressed; and also that the said corporation and their successors at all times hereafter shall be able to purchase, receive, have, hold and enjoy to them and their successors all and all manner of lands, tenements, rents, annuities, liberties, franchises and other hereditaments, goods and chattels of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time to sell, alien, grant, and dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value of the messuages, houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities or other hereditaments, and the real estate of the said corporation and the interest on the money by them lent shall not exceed the sum of two thousand dollars; and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break and alter and renew at pleasure; and also ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth; and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.
