AN ACT

To confer upon William Huston the right to keep in repair and to use a certain well of water in the village of West Fairfield.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the right to repair and use a well of water situate on one of the streets in the village of West Fairfield, and county of Westmoreland, and heretofore sunk and occupied by William Huston, is hereby vested in the said William Huston: *Provided,* That all the inhabitants of said village shall have the privilege of using said well of water in such manner as not in any wise to do any injury to the same. Proviso
