AN ACT

For the protection of the property of Allegheny college.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That it shall not be lawful for the trustees of Allegheny college or any one else to sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, or in any way incumber the grounds, buildings, library or apparatus of Allegheny college, in Crawford county aforesaid, or to create any debt or liability by which the same may be sold, assigned, transferred or incumbered; but that any debt or liability to be created shall be collectable and payable only out of other funds and resources of the institution.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act entitled "An Act incorporating the Bridge Point, Bushington and Centreville turnpike road company," passed the twenty-seventh day of July, eighteen hundred and forty-two, and for other purposes.

WHEREAS, The commissioners appointed by the act of the twenty-seventh day of July, eighteen hundred and forty-two, incorporating the Bridge Point, Bushington and Centreville turnpike company, having neglected to open the books to receive subscriptions for the stock of said company within the time specified in the said act; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the time for opening said books be extended until on or before the first day of May next, and the officers directed to be elected by the third section of the act of incorporation shall conduct the business until the first day of November next, when an election is to be held agreeably to the provisions of said act.

Vacancy

SECTION 2. That when any vacancy shall happen in the presidency, board of managers, secretary or treasurer of the "Doylestown and Willow Grove turnpike road company" by death, resignation, removal from the commonwealth or otherwise, that it shall be lawful for the president and managers or a majority of them to fill the vacancy by appointment in such manner as any other business of the company may lawfully be done, such appointment to continue till the next election of officers by the stockholders; that the said company may charge toll on pleasure carriages of all descriptions, in double the amount they may now by law charge for burthen or market carriages drawn by the same number of horses; and all burthen carriages shall be rated by the number of horses by which they are drawn.

SECTION 3. That it shall be lawful for the Cherry Ridge and East Stirling turnpike road company, in the county of Wayne, on the subscriptions of seventy-five shares of capital stock, to proceed to build the said road under the same regulations as are enjoined by existing laws relative to said turnpike road.

SECTION 4. That the school directors of Mead township, in the county of Crawford, be and they are hereby authorized to fix the site for and erect thereon a school house in each sub-school district in said township: *Provided,* That before the erection of said house the directors aforesaid shall apply to the court of quarter sessions of said county for the assessment of damages to be occasioned thereby to the owner or owners of the lands upon which the site is fixed, which shall be done in the same manner as is now directed by law in case of damages occasioned by the laying out and opening of private roads, and paid out of the proper school fund before the erection of said house.
