AN ACT

To change the name of a certain volunteer corps.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the style and title of a certain Name change-volunteer corps attached to the ninety-seventh regiment, first^{ed} brigade, seventh division, Pennsylvania militia, now called the "Democratic Artillery," be and the same is hereby changed to "Delaware Greys;" and the said corps is hereby authorized to elect their complement of officers, to be commissioned by the governor, according to the style and title of "Delaware Greys."

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act the "Light Artillery Corps, Washington Greys," attached to the Light Artillery first brigade, first division, Pennsylvania militia, shall hereafter be called the "Artillery Corps, Washington Greys;" ^{ry Corps} *Provided,* That all acts done under the former name of ^{Washington Greys name} "Light Infantry Corps, Washington Greys," or "Light Artillery Corps, Washington Greys," shall not be affected in any manner by this act: *And provided further,* That the said corps shall enjoy all the advantages in point of rank of company and officers, as if this act had not been passed.
