AN ACT

For the relief of Daniel Henderson, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

York co Valentine Coleman of York county, Mary Slaysman of Baltimore city, John Long, Allegheny county, Dorothy Fluck of Allegheny Bedford county; soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each; immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three; and to Zadock Hultz, George Brickle of Allegheny county, Jacob Corl of Berks county, William Brown, Berks Beaver county, Jemima Brown, Mercer county, Christopher Truby, Clarion county, William Burns, Ashtalusa county, Ohio, Margaret Dimm, Lycoming, Robert Cather, Henry Slater, Greene county, Mary Nugent of Indiana county, or their respective orders, each, forty dollars, as a gratuity, immediately, for their services in the revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to pay to—George Singley of Westmoreland, Samuel Lindsay of Venango county, John Keller of Allegheny county, Jane Barnwell of the city of Pittsburg, Elizabeth Miller of Susquehanna county, Barbara Walter of Lancaster county, Susanna Tunison of the city of Philadelphia, Catharine Sheib of Philadelphia county, Jacob Ammon of Holmes county, Ohio, Sarah Davidson of the city of Baltimore, Eleanor Donaran of York county, and Abigail Wallace of Chester county, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, forty dollars each, immediately, as a gratuity, and an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three.

SECTION 3. That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to the widow and heirs of John Weitzell, late of Northumberland county, deceased, or to their legal representatives, the sum of two hundred dollars, in lieu of a donation tract of land, situated in the tenth district, number nineteen hundred and fifty-six, containing two hundred acres, to which the said John Weitzel was entitled for his revolutionary services.
