RESOLUTION

Authorizing the cancellation of certain sums of the notes issued under the act of fourth May, eighteen hundred and forty-one.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed, on the thirty-first of January, eighteen hundred and forty-three, or within two days after the passage of this act, to cancel and hand over to the auditor general for destruction, one hundred thousand dollars of the most depreciated of the issues of the fourth of May, eighteen hundred and forty-one, that may then be in the treasury; and to retain, and on the last day of every month thereafter, cancel and hand over to the auditor general for destruction, one hundred thousand dollars of the most depreciated of the aforesaid issues that may then be in the treasury, and until the whole amount issued under the aforesaid act of the fourth of May, eighteen hundred and forty-one, shall be cancelled and destroyed; and the amounts deposited to the credit of the commonwealth in the banks and savings institutions, or received by collectors or county treasurers, shall be deemed and considered as money in the treasury, and subject to cancellation as herein directed: *Provided,* That at the end of every month, the auditor general shall publish in at least two of the newspapers in the borough of Harrisburg, an official statement of the amount of the said issues thus cancelled, designating at the same time the banks from which the same first issued; and so much of any act or resolution as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed.
