Correcting an error in the act of sixteenth of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, relative to Luzerne County Auditors.

WHEREAS. An error occurred in transcribing the act of sixteenth July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, entitled "An Act to authorize the court of common pleas of Luzerne county to appoint auditors in certain cases, and for other purposes," making the word "county" read "court," where it occurs the second time in the first section of the said act; for remedy whereof, it is

Preamble

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met*, That in giving a construction to the said act, the word court, where it occurs the second time in the first section of

the said act, shall read county; and all proceedings under the said law shall be as available as though the said error had not been made; and the last proviso in the second section of the said act of the sixteenth of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, is hereby repealed; and the court of common pleas of Luzerne county shall make such order as to costs in the matter as shall be just and equitable, but the officer whose accounts shall be examined shall be entitled to the daily pay allowed in the proviso hereby repealed, if there shall be no balance found against him, and if a balance shall be found against him, it shall then be discretionary with the said court whether the daily pay shall be allowed.
