

the said act, shall read county; and all proceedings under the said law shall be as available as though the said error had not been made; and the last proviso in the second section of the said act of the sixteenth of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, is hereby repealed; and the court of common pleas of Luzerne county shall make such order as to costs in the matter as shall be just and equitable, but the officer whose accounts shall be examined shall be entitled to the daily pay allowed in the proviso hereby repealed, if there shall be no balance found against him, and if a balance shall be found against him, it shall then be discretionary with the said court whether the daily pay shall be allowed.

RESOLUTION

Relative to the election of officers in the township of Bloss, in the county of Tioga.

RESOLVED, *By the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the twenty-eighth section of an act passed the twenty-fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, entitled "An Act to appoint commissioners to resurvey and mark that portion of the county line which divides the township of Bristol, in the county of Philadelphia, from the township of Cheltenham, in the county of Montgomery, and for other purposes," shall not be so construed as to legalize the election of township officers in the township of Bloss, in the county of Tioga, for more than one year from said election; and the qualified voters thereof are hereby authorized, on the next annual township election, to elect township officers the same as if said act had never been passed.
