

authorized and empowered to sell at public or private sale, the lot of ground upon which a house for public worship is erected, with the appurtenances thereto belonging, to wit: beginning at a stone in the public road; thence south seventy-two degrees west seventeen and one fourth perches to a post; thence north eight degrees west eight perches to a post; thence north seventy-two degrees east seventeen and one-half perches to a post; thence south twenty-eight degrees east eight perches to the place of beginning, being part of a tract of land, number seven hundred and forty-six, in the fourth district of donation land, and to assure and convey unto the purchaser or purchasers, by deed or other legal conveyances, in fee simple, the said lot with the appurtenances thereto belonging: *Provided*, That the proceeds arising from the sale of said property shall be faithfully appropriated to the purchase of materials for, and the erection of a new house of public worship, for the use of said church.

AN ACT

Relative to the courts of Wayne county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, the county of Wayne shall be and is hereby attached to the Eastern district of the supreme court, and that all writs of error and certiorari, and all appeals and proceedings now depending in the Northern district of said court, or which shall be depending therein, prior to the second Monday in July next, from the said court of Wayne county, shall be returned and removed into the Eastern district for determination.*
