AN ACT

For the relief of Ann Merklin, of the county of Lancaster.

WHEREAS, Charles F. Merklin, of Chambersburg, Franklin county, in this commonwealth, is of unsound mind and incapable of managing his affairs :

And whereas, Ann Merklin, his wife, is entitled to a distributive share of the personal estate of her late uncle, John Forrey, of Lancaster county, deceased, but is unable to demand, sue for and recover the same, in consequence of the insanity of her said husband ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the said Ann Merklin, be and she is hereby authorized to demand, receive, sue for and recover, in her own name, any estate, real, personal or mixed, to which she may be entitled, in her own right, as fully and effectually as if she were sole and unmarried ; and to give all necessary receipts and acquittances, and to enter satisfaction upon judgments, and generally to do all acts necessary to the recovery and control of her property, rights and claims, as completely in all respects as if she were sole and unmarried.
