AN ACT

Relative to the estate of Daniel Reiley, deceased.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* it shall and may be lawful for the orphans' court of the county of Columbia, upon the petition of Joseph Gibson and Jesse Gresh, administrators with the will annexed of Daniel Reiley, late of Limestone township, in the said county, deceased, or of any other person interested, to be made at the next, or any subsequent term of the said court, to confirm the sale of the real estate of the said decedent, heretofore made by the said administrators to Joseph Our, by virtue of the power to sell, contained in the will of the said testator, and of an order of sale made by the said orphans' court, notwithstanding the said sale was made after the day on which the said order of sale was returnable; and if the said sale shall be confirmed by the said court, then and in that case, it shall be lawful for the said administrators, or the survivor of them, to execute a good and sufficient deed for the said real estate to the said purchaser, his heirs or assigns, which said deed of conveyance shall be deemed and held as good and valid execution of the power to sell, contained in the will of the said testator.

AN ACT

To incorporate the Phoenix hose company of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* all and every the persons who shall, at the time of the passing of this Name. act, be honorary and active members of the association called the "Phoenix

hose company." shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, style and title of the Phoenix hose company, and by the same name shall have perpetual succession, and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded in all courts of record or elsewhere, and to purchase, receive, have, hold, and enjoy to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattels, of what nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action, and the same from time to time, to sell, grant, devise, alien or dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear yearly value or income of the necessary houses, lands and tenements, rents and annuities, or other hereditaments and real estate of the said corporation, and the interest of the money by it lent, shall not exceed the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars, and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also to ordain, establish, and put in execution such by laws, ordinances and regulations, as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter or the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular, the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof.

SECTION 2. That the object of the said corporation shall be the promotion of the public good, by the extinguishment of fires.
