AN ACT

Authorizing the governor to incorporate the Union turnpike road company of Wyoming and Luzerne counties.

Commissioners.	SECTION 1. <i>Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,</i> That Sherman D. Phelps, Alpha Durham, Willard Jackson, Abel Gritman, Hosa Carpenter and John P. Farnham, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to open books, receive subscriptions and organize a company by the name, style and title of "The Union turnpike road company," with power to construct a turnpike road, commencing at the
Style.	borough of Tunkhannock, in Wyoming county, and extending by the nearest and most practicable route to Archibald, in Luzerne county, subject to all the provisions and restrictions of an act regulating turnpike and plank road companies, approved the twenty-sixth day of January, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine.
Location.	SECTION 2. That the capital stock of said company shall consist of four hundred shares of twenty-five dollars each.
Subject to all the provisions and restrictions of certain act.	SECTION 3. That if said company shall not commence the construction of said road within two years, and complete the same within five years, this act shall be null and void, except so far as the same may be necessary to wind up the affairs, and pay the debts of the company.
