A N A C T

To exempt the poor house of the city of Allegheny from taxation; relative to the salary of the directors of the poor of York county; and to regulate the settlement of paupers in Delaware county.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That land of Allegheny city, except for state purposes. Poor house and the land thereto appertaining, owned by the city of Allegheny, and used for the employment and support of the poor of said city, be and the same are hereby exempted from taxation, except for state purposes.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the directors of the poor of the county of York, shall each be entitled to a salary of fifty dollars per annum. Directors of the poor of York county, salary of.

SECTION 3. That so much of the ninth section of the act, entitled "An Act relating to the support and employment of the poor," passed June thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, requiring persons to take a bona fide lease of real estate of the yearly value of ten dollars, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as relates to the county of Delaware; and hereafter in lieu thereof, any person coming into the said county of Delaware, shall acquire a residence on the same terms, and in the same manner, as a citizen of said county of Delaware would have acquired a residence in the county from which said person may have come.
