AN ACT

Supplementary to an act, entitled "An Act authorizing the laying out of certain state roads, and for other purposes," passed the tenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight; and a supplement to an act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Little Conemaugh, at Johnstown, Cambria county, approved the eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the privileges and immunities granted to the Pittsburg and Steubenville Turnpike company, by the fourteenth and fifteenth sections of the act of the tenth of April, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, entitled "An Act authorizing the laying out of certain state roads, and for other purposes," are hereby declared to be perpetual; and the said act shall be deemed to extend to, and embrace all bridges that have been or may hereafter be erected across the mouth of Saw Mill run by said company, on the site of the bridge referred to in the said act; and the court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county, is hereby authorized to exercise the same jurisdiction and power in regard to said bridge, as they have hitherto exercised under the act referred to.

SECTION 2. That Robert P. Linton and John Galbraith be and they Robert P. Linton are hereby appointed commissioners, in the place and stead of Philip Goughnour and George S. King, for the purpose of performing the duties specified in the act of the general assembly, of the eleventh day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, entitled "An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company to erect a bridge over the Little Conemaugh, at Johnstown, in Cambria county."

SECTION 3. That so much of an act, approved the eighth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, entitled "An Act authorizing certain state roads," as authorizes the laying out of a state road from Mount Pleasant, in Westmoreland county, by the way of East Liberty, in Fayette county, to Uniontown, be and the same is hereby repealed; and that the road laid out by authority of the said act, be and the same is hereby declared to be vacated.
