

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified voters of the several districts of Union and Northumberland counties, shall be permitted to vote at the ensuing general election, for and against the erection of a county poor house, in and for said counties respectively. Qualified voters to be permitted to vote for or against the erection of a county poor house.

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the officers holding the general election at the time and places provided by law, to receive from every person qualified to vote, a written or printed ticket containing the words "for a poor house," or the words "against a poor house," and after the polls shall be closed, add up the votes thus polled, and make return thereof in like manner as that for county commissioners; the sheriff of said counties shall give notice thereof to the qualified electors of said counties, as is provided for in the election of members of the general assembly. A SUPPLEMENT
