

shall have the right to vote at the annual and other elections and meetings of said company as stockholders.

SECTION 17. That if the said company shall not proceed to carry on said work within two years after they shall have been incorporated, or shall not within the space of five years thereafter complete the said bridge, it shall and may be lawful for the legislature of this commonwealth to revoke the charter of said company, except so far as may be necessary to wind up its affairs; and it shall be lawful for the legislature to resume all and singular the rights, liberties and privileges hereby granted to said company.

SECTION 18. That the said company shall construct the aforesaid bridge so that it shall not impede, obstruct or injure the ascending, descending or steamboat navigation of said Allegheny river; and the legislature reserves the right at any time hereafter to alter, amend or repeal this charter: *Provided however*, That no injustice shall be done to the incorporators.

AN ACT

Relating to the judicial districts of this commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* 18th judicial district.
from and after the passage of this act, the eighteenth judicial district shall consist of the counties of Venango, Clarion, Jefferson, Elk and Forest.

The thirteenth judicial district shall consist of the counties of Bradford, Tioga, Potter and McKean. 13th judicial district.

The eleventh judicial district shall consist of the counties of Luzerne, Susquehanna and Wyoming. 11th judicial district.

The sixth judicial district, of the counties of Erie, Crawford and Warren. 6th judicial district.

The twenty-first judicial district, of the county of Schuylkill. 21st judicial district.

The counties of Wayne, Pike, Monroe and Carbon shall be and are hereby erected into a separate judicial district, to be called the twenty-second district. 22d judicial district.

The counties of Northampton and Lehigh shall constitute the third judicial district. 3d judicial district.

23d judicial district. The county of Berks shall be and is hereby erected into a separate judicial district, to be called the twenty-third district.

24th judicial district. The counties of Huntingdon, Blair and Cambria shall be and are hereby erected into a separate judicial district, to be called the twenty-fourth district.

Governor to appoint and commission persons learned in the law, as president judges. SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of the governor of this commonwealth, pursuant to the provisions of the constitution, to appoint and commission a person of integrity, learned in the law, to be president judge of the courts of common pleas in each of the said twenty-second, twenty-third and twenty-fourth districts, which said president judges shall respectively receive like salaries and compensation, and have and execute all and singular the powers, jurisdiction and authority of president judge of the courts of common pleas, court of oyer and terminer, general jail delivery, orphans' court and justices of the quarter sessions of the peace in each of the said districts, as are conferred on other president judges of the commonwealth, agreeably to the constitution and laws.

Said counties to continue attached to their respective districts of the supreme court. SECTION 3. Each of the several counties referred to in this act, shall continue attached to their respective districts of the supreme court to which they are now attached by law, and the supreme court may from time to time, fix and establish the return days of writs of error to each of such counties.

Terms of the several courts in Venango county. SECTION 4. The respective courts shall be held in the county of Venango on the fourth Mondays in February, April, August and November, to continue one week.

Clarion. In the county of Clarion, on the first Mondays in May, September, December and February.

Jefferson. In the county of Jefferson, on the second Mondays in May, September, December and February, one week.

Elk. In the county of Elk, on the third Monday in May, September, December and February, one week.

Forest. In the county of Forest, on the fourth Mondays in May, September, December and February, one week.

Wayne. In the county of Wayne, on the first Mondays in February, May, September and December, one week.

Pike. In the county of Pike, on the third Monday in February, May, September and December, one week.

Monroe. In the county of Monroe, on the fourth Monday in February, May, September and December, one week.

Carbon. In the county of Carbon, on the third Monday in January, April, August and November, one week.

Lehigh. In the county of Lehigh, on the Monday next following the fourth Mondays in January, April, August and November, two weeks.

Northampton. In the county of Northampton, on the third Mondays in January, April, August and November, two weeks.

Schuylkill. In the county of Schuylkill, on the first Mondays in March, June, September and December, four weeks.

Berks. In the county of Berks, on the first Mondays in January, April, August and November, three weeks.

Bradford. In the county of Bradford, on the first Mondays in February, May, September and December, three weeks.

Tioga. In the county of Tioga, on the fourth Mondays in February, May, September and October, one week.

Potter. In the county of Potter, on the second Mondays after the fourth Mondays in February, May, September and December, one week.

M'Kean. In the county of M'Kean, on the Mondays after the court in Potter county.

In the county of Huntingdon, on the second Mondays in April, Huntingdon. August, November and January, two weeks.

In the county of Blair, on the third Mondays in March, July, October and December.

In the county of Cambria, on the first Mondays in January, April, Cambria. July and October.

In the county of Luzerne, on the first Mondays in April, August, Luzerne. November and January, two weeks.

In the county of Susquehanna, on the third Mondays in April, August, Susquehanna. November and January.

In the county of Wyoming, on the Mondays succeeding the courts Wyoming. in Susquehanna county.

In the county of Erie, on the first Mondays in February, May, August and November.

In the county of Crawford, on the second Mondays in February, Crawford. April, August and November.

In the county of Warren, on the Mondays next following the fourth Warren. Mondays in February, June, August and November.

SECTION 5. It shall be lawful for the courts in the counties of Elk, Forest, Potter, M'Kean and Pike, to determine from time to time, at what number of terms in each year a grand and traverse jury shall be summoned in each of said counties, and to make their orders to the commissioners and sheriff to draw and summon the juries accordingly. SECTION 6. All and every act inconsistent with this act and its provisions, be and are hereby repealed.

Lawful for the counties of Elk, Forest, Potter and M'Kean, to determine what number of terms in each year a grand and traverse jury shall be summoned, &c.

AN ACT

To extend the charter of the Bank of Chester County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the charter of the Bank of Chester County shall be and the same is hereby extended and continued, for the purpose of transacting the business of banking, at its present location, for the term of fifteen years*
